Two Important, Unsung Jewish Agencies Open Temple Emanu-El's Annual TE Talks Series

Sandy Springs, GA – North Atlanta's Temple Emanu-El kicks off its 2018 "TE TALKS" series with the leaders of two unique, important, yet little known organizations. Both are innovative agencies meeting important needs in the Jewish Community.

Metro Atlanta Community Mikvah (MCoM) is the only Atlanta ritual bath that welcomes Conservative and Reform Jews seeking spiritual enrichment. The second agency, the Southern Jewish Resource Network for Gender and Sexual Diversity (SOJOURN) embraces people who are gender-and sexually diverse.

Speakers Alice Wertheim, MCoM's first president, and Rebecca Stapel-Wax, SOJOURN's executive director will provide background on their two organizations, followed by Q&A. Interested adults and mature teens are encouraged to attend. The program is free, and open to congregants and members of the Reform and Conservative Jewish community
