Delgado Announces Congressional App Challenge, Calls for Submissions in NY-19

The Congressional App Challenge is open to all middle school and high school students who live in New York's 19th Congressional District. Students entering the competition must submit source code along with a YouTube or VIMEO video that explains and demonstrates their app and what they learned through the competition process.

The final deadline for submissions to this year's competition is Monday, Oct. 19. Students are encouraged to register and begin work on their proj ects as soon as possible. The winning individual or team will be featured on Delgado. house.gov and CongressionalAppChallenge.us, and the winning app will be placed on display in the U.S. Capitol alongside winners from across the country. 

Historic Marker Will Honor Cauliflower Industry

The annual Cauliflower Festival in Margaretville will not be held this Saturday due to the Covid pandemic, but the weekend will nonetheless feature the unveiling of a historic marker at the site where the region's cauliflower industry first took root.

The Historical Society of the Town of Middletown (HSM), in collaboration with Margaretville Mountain Inn, invites the public to a short ceremony Sunday, Sept. 27 at 2 p.m. The Inn is located about two miles up Margaretville Mountain Road which begins as Walnut Street in the Village of Margaretville. This important site in Catskills' agricultural history was the former William and Thankful VanBenschoten farm overlooking the East Branch valley.

In the mid-1890s, 20 years after cauliflower began to be grown commercially on Long Island. William F. VanBenschoten, obtained 100 cauliflower plants from acquaintances there. His wife, Thankful Sanford VanBenschoten, reportedly nursed the first plants in flower pots in her kitchen. They did so well the couple set 200 plants the following year and peddled the fresh cauliflower to boarding houses in Fleischmanns.

The year after that, they put in 2,000 plants, and began shipping the crop in iced barrels on trains to the New York City market. Soon, other local farmers began planting cauliflower and by the 19-teens the Catskills became renowned for its fine quality 'white gold.' This was a major industry here through the mid-20th century.

The Van Benschotens also kept a boarding house. They built their lovely Victorian home in 1890 to accommodate summer visitors. Listed on the state and national registers of historic places, Margaretville Mountain Inn still welcomes tourists and hosts weddings. It has been operated by Carol Molnar and family for 30 years.

In addition to previous Congressional outreach, numerous stakeholders have reached out to the Administration to request clarifications and improvements.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has created near-Great-Depression levels of unemployment in the United States," said Dan Egan, Executive Director at Feeding New York State. "New York's ten food banks have had to

double our food distribution as the need for charitable food skyrocketed. At the same time, our farmers lost many of their markets and had surplus food available. New Yorkers have stepped up at the farm, at the food bank and in every community to support each other in this crisis. It's not clear to us why USDA was not able to do the same. Because we are far from the end of this crisis, the Covid-19 Farm Assistance Program must be continued on page 10

sional Delegation July 13 in a stern letter to Sonny Perdue, Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), demanding answers and public transparency over the agency's mishandling of the USDA Food Box program.

"Both our family farmers in upstate and most vulnerable populations have experienced dire consequences from the coronavirus pandemic and it is essential that the programs designed to assist both communities are transparent and good stewards of taxpayer dollars," said Rep. Delgado, a member of the House Agriculture Committee. "I authored this letter with Rep. Tonko to get the answers we need from the Trump Administration about how these contract decisions were made and their plans to ensure that going forward these resources are awarded in a transparent manner and in a way that ensures our region of the country is properly accounted for."

"Following several efforts by Congress and others to raise concerns with USDA, the Trump Administration could easily have remedied these issues of inequity and transparency," noted Rep. Tonko. "Instead they have chosen to double down on their obvious and puzzling mismanagement of this vital food assistance program

worsening COVID-19 epidemic. I cannot fathom why USDA continues to exclude local food banks that are already set up to do this work in support of the neediest among us. Instead, USDA has chosen to award lucrative food distribution contracts to small out-of-state companies that have little or no presence or capacity here. This kind of mismanagement does real and lasting harm to the people and communities we serve, and USDA needs to an-

swer for it." Despite Congressional outreach and growing media attention on the issue, USDA continues to assign disproportionately few contracts to organizations covering the Northeastern United States. New York and New England together account for 10% of the national population but received just 4% of contract funding in the first round and even less in the second. Some areas have been overlooked entirely. For example, the Northeast Regional Food Bank, which serves 23 counties including Delaware County, was completely shut out of the second round of distribution contracts after only receiving one contract in the first. Food banks in service areas without contracts are being left to beg for contracts from vendors out of their area,

• Protect fruit trees. If you have fruit trees, install mouse guards around the base to prevent mice and voles from killing the trees over the winter. If left to their own devices over the winter, mice and voles may eat the bark of fruit trees, killing the trees as a result. The Farmer's Almanac notes that mouse guards made of fine mesh hardware cloth can effectively protect fruit trees

Gutters hanging off the home: Gutters were once installed predominantly with spikes. However, many industry professionals now install gutters with hanger brackets. Why the change? • Basement flooding: Not all signs of deteriorating gutters are outside a home. Many a homeowner has been flummoxed by flooding in their basements, and such flooding can be caused by aging, ineffective gutters. That's because deteriorating gutters sometimes allow water to leak near the foundation of a home, contributing to basement flooding.

Weeds and debris left to linger in gardens through the winter provide overwintering spots for insects and can contribute to disease. So it's imperative that weeds and debris are removed ing blueberries. Test the soil for lime and amend it depending on what you hope to grow in the spring so it's ready to thrive when winter ends.

• Remove dead or diseased plants. Dead or diseased plants should not be left in the garden through the winter. These plants can attract insects and are vulnerable to disease, which from hungry mice and voles over the winter.

A gardener's work is never done, and the work to create beautiful spring gardens begins in the fall.

continued from page 7 scrutinized and improved so that it can become the major contributor it ought to be, ensuring all Americans get enough to eat and all farms are supported."

"We are pleased that we have been able to receive additional food through the CFAP program to help us feed the thousands of people in need during this pandemic," said Mark Quandt, Director of the Northeast Regional Food Bank. "However, we are also disappointed in the implementation of the program. Only one vendor in the entire 23 county region we serve was awarded a contract to distribute food, so we had to reach out to companies in other states and other parts of New York State and hope they would provide food for us. We had some success, but the process was difficult and cumbersome, and the quality of the boxes varied greatly from vendor to vendor. We hoped the process would improve in round two that began on July 1, but we heard nothing from USDA or vendors until the very end of June and we still have no idea how much food we will be receiving in this round. The program has great potential and I believe it has worked well for some food banks, but it is not living up to its potential in our area."





Latham, NY - The New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) announced today that football, volleyball and competitive cheer fall seasons will be postponed until March 1, 2021 to address membership concerns associated with high-risk fall sports. The decision was rendered by the elected NYSPHSAA officers late this afternoon. Low and moderate risk fall sports, meanwhile, are still authorized to begin practices on September 21, 2020 as previously announced.

"We've spent two days speaking with nearly 500 athletic directors across the state and it's clear that administering high-risk fall sports during the COVID-19 pandemic presents a significant challenge for our member schools," said Dr. Robert Zayas, NYSPHSAA Executive Director. "These are unprecedented times and unfortunately, difficult decisions will have to be made to address this ongoing crisis. We continue to stay committed to providing support to our member schools and quality participation experiences for the students we serve."

The revised season for football, volleyball and fall competitive cheer will be known as "Fall Sports Season II" and may officially begin practices on

April 19, 2021 (the original start date was March 15). "The NYSPHSAA officers

have determined it would be unrealistic to host football, volleyball and competitive cheer seasons this fall," said Julie Bergman, NYSPHSAA President. "This continues to be the most challenging situation educators have ever addressed. I, along with my fellow officers, believe the participation experiences for football, volleyball and competitive cheer athletes will be more beneficial in the spring than in the fall."

Low and moderate risk fall sports practices are still scheduled to begin on September 21st for those schools and sections who have determined it feasible to host interscholastic athletics at this time. Regular season games can begin for low and moderate risk fall sports (girls tennis, cross country, girls swimming/ diving, boys soccer, girls soccer, field hockey) once student-athletes have participated in the required number of practices as per NYSPHSAA bylaws.



DEC Confirms Epizootic Hemorrhagic **Disease in Putnam** and Orange County Deer

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) confirmed that several whitetailed deer in the towns of Nelsonville and Cold Spring in Putnam County and near Goshen in Orange County died after contracting Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease (EHD). EHD is a viral disease of white-tailed deer that cannot be contracted

by humans.

EHD virus is carried by biting midges, small bugs often called no-see-ums or 'punkies.' Once infected with EHD, deer usually die within 36 hours. The disease is not spread from deer to deer or from deer to humans.

DEC wildlife biologists collected half a dozen deer carcasses in Putnam County and submitted the carcasses to the Wildlife Health Unit for necropsy. Tissue samples were sent to the Animal Health Diagnostic Center at Cornell University where the preliminary diagnosis of EHD

was confirmed. DEC also sent samples from four deer from Orange County where the preliminary diagnosis of EHD was confirmed.

The EHD virus was first confirmed in New York in 2007 in Albany, Rensselaer, and Niagara counties, and in Rockland County in 2011. EHD outbreaks are most common in the late summer and early fall when midges are abundant. EHD symptoms include fever, hemorrhage in muscle or organs, swelling of the head, neck, tongue, and lips. A deer infected with EHD may appear lame or dehydrated. Frequently, infected deer

will seek out water sources and many succumb near a water source. There is no treatment for nor means to prevent EHD. The dead deer do not serve as a source of infection for other animals.

EHD outbreaks do not have a significant long-term impact on deer populations. EHD is endemic in the southern states where there are annual outbreaks, so some southern deer have developed immunity. Generally, in the northeast, EHD outbreaks occur sporadically and deer in New York have no immunity to this virus. Consequently, most EHD-infected deer in

New York are expected to die. In the north, the first hard frost kills the midges that transmit the disease, ending the EHD outbreak.

Hunters should not handle or eat any deer that appears sick or acts strangely. DEC will continue to monitor the situation. Sightings of sick or dying deer should be reported to the nearest DEC Regional Office or to an Environmental Conservation Police Officer. In addition, the Department of Agriculture and Markets has alerted deer farmers and veterinarians throughout the state to be aware of the continued on page 12

CWC Approves Funding For Many Programs

On September 1, the Catskill Watershed Corporation (CWC) Board of Directors approved funding for projects in the Septic Program, Stormwater Retrofit Program, Community Wastewater Management Program, and the Flood Hazard Program.

Funding for the repair or replacement of eight residential septic systems for homeowners in five towns in Delaware, Greene and Ulster Counties was approved. CWC authorized funding for the operation and maintenance costs of a previously completed stormwater retrofit project in Greene County. Additional funding was also approved for two Community Wastewater Management projects in the Town of Shandaken and the hamlet of West Conesville.

In the Flood Hazard Program, funding for five feasibility studies in the Town of Hunter were approved for two applicants to determine potential flood mitigation options at each property. Design funding was also approved for two projects in the Town of Prattsville to implement recommendations from prior feasibility studies that had been completed. Finally, construction funding was approved for a business in the Village of Walton to fill in an existing crawl space and install a new concrete floor.

The CWC is a non-profit, Local Development Corporation responsible for several environmental protection, economic development, and education programs in the New York City Watershed West of the Hudson River. www.cwconline.org

Nourish New York Continues to Grow


Nourish New York, Governor Cuomo's initiative to get surplus food from farmers to families in need during the COVID-19 outbreak, reached a milestone in June as the amount of surplus dairy, produce and other products provided through New York's food banks reached over 4.3 million pounds.

Food banks across the state have purchased more than \$4 million in Nour-

ish NY product from New York's processors and farmers who have temporarily lost markets as a result of COVID-19. This includes 1.7 million pounds of dairy products, including fluid milk, yogurt, cheese, cottage cheese, and sour cream, and more than 2 million pounds of produce, such as fruits and vegetables, that have been provided to more than 140,000 New York households. There have been over 500 Nourish NY food distribution events held across New York to help families in need since the program was launched in May.

In addition, the state also

launched a new Nourish New York web page, found at agriculture.ny.gov/nourishny, to more easily connect food banks with New York's farmers who have product available for purchase. The website allows farmers to submit product type, volume, and other information directly to the page, and allows the food banks to easily search for agricultural products that are in need. Rep. Delgado Statement on Bipartisan Great American Outdoors Act Becoming Law

WASHINGTON, DC – Today, U.S. Representative Antonio Delgado (NY-19) released the following statement on H.R. 1957, the Great American Outdoors Act, becoming law. The law will provide permanent, full funding for the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) and establish the National Parks and Public Land Legacy Restoration Fund, ensuring critical investments in our national parks, public lands, and current and future conservation efforts. Rep. Delgado voted for this bipartisan legislation on July 22, 2020.

"The Great American Outdoors Act is finally law and will permanently fund the Land and Water Conservation Fund and protect public lands across upstate New York including NY-19 gems like the Delaware River Watershed, Catskill Mountains, and Hudson River area," said Rep. Delgado. "Protecting our planet should be a bipartisan priority and I am glad to see this legislation become law with support on both sides of the aisle. This law will support thousands of jobs maintaining these green spaces and protecting our precious natural landscapes for generations to come."

The Great American Outdoors Act ensures that the \$900 million permanently authorized by Congress last year funds the Land and


