

In areas where black bears live, DEC recommends removing feeders in April so they do not attract hungry black bears when they emerge from hibernation. If you continue to feed birds, it is good practice to clean your bird feeders regularly. Two diseases are commonly spread at bird feeders: Salmonellosis, which affects common redpolls, pine siskins, and other songbirds; and, Finch conjunctivitis which primarily infects house finches and American goldfinches. Other diseases po-

tentially spread at feeders include Aspergillosis (sometimes associated with moldy seed) or Trichomoniasis (a protozoan parasite spread at bird baths. Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza is not thought to be related to bird feeding or songbirds.

Clean bird feeders every two weeks with a warm, soapy solution and brush to remove solid particles, then sanitize for 10 minutes with a 10% bleach solution (one part household bleach, nine parts water), and allow the feeder to dry thoroughly before refilling with feed.

Although no cases of the mysterious songbird eye disease were seen in New York last year, DEC will monitor birds this spring and summer and encourage people to report any unusual mortalities in fledgling birds this season, especially American robins, blue jays, common grackles, and European starlings.



# All Income-Eligible New Yorkers Could Qualify for an Air Conditioner

### Program Expected to serve an Estimated 20,000 Low-Income Households

Governor Hochul announced on May 2 that \$15 million is available through the Home Energy Assistance Program to help low-income individuals and families who lack air conditioning to stay cool during the upcoming summer months. Under the direction of the Governor, the state Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance the agency administering HEAP - expanded eligibility for the cooling component to more effectively assist those in need by including all income-eligible New Yorkers.

"For too many New Yorkers, relief from the stifling heat that summer brings each year is prohibitively expensive," Governor Hochul said. "By expanding the eligibility guidelines for cooling assistance, we can help ensure that more low-income and disadvantaged households have the means to stay comfortable and safe when temperatures inevitably rise."

To qualify for cooling as-

sistance under the amended guidelines, applicants must meet HEAP eligibility criteria and income thresholds, which vary by household size. For instance, a family of four may have a maximum gross monthly income of \$5,249 or an annual gross income of \$62,983. Prior to this year, the cooling component of HEAP was only available to income-eligible households with an individual suffering from a documented medical condition exacerbated by extreme heat.

The program covers the cost of an air conditioning unit and installation. Under the expanded eligibility, the cooling component is expected to serve up to 20,000 households throughout the state.

Applications for cooling assistance will be accepted at local departments of social services starting Monday, May 2 and extending through August 31, or until funding runs out. Assistance is provided on a firstcome, first-served basis. New York City residents may download an application and obtain program information at access.nyc. gov.

The cooling assistance program provided about 11,300 benefits throughout the state last year alone. More than 36,000 households throughout New York have benefited from cooling assistance over the past five years.

Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance Commissioner Daniel W. Tietz said, "Summer inevitably brings sweltering temperatures that are not only uncomfortable for New Yorkers lacking the ability to cool their homes, but also pose significant risk of heat-related health emergencies. The expanded eligibility for cooling assistance will be welcome relief for low-income households that struggle to moderate the heat during the hottest days of summer."

WALTON - The Delaware Valley Agricultural Society (DVAS) was presented with a \$265,000 check allocated from Delaware County American rescue funds, by Walton Supervisor Joe Cetta on April 24. The money will be used to make infrastructure upgrades at the fairgrounds in Walton.

Based upon a 2013 study, paid attendance was 77,014 with \$5,701,269 in sales and county-wide tax revenue of \$251,466, attributed to the fair. Specific improvements, Rossley said, include improving the water pipeline from the village of Walton to the fairgrounds in addition to renovating restroom facilities.

### Communities can work together to make prom night safer


Spring is in the air and that means high school juniors and seniors across the country are getting ready to party the night away at their respective school proms.

Even though these rites of passage are well-known as opportunities to make lasting memories, prom also is associated with several risky behaviors. Underage alcohol use is among the poor choices that teens may face on prom night. However, parents and community members can work collectively

to keep promgoers happy and safe this season.

• Liquor lock down: Merchants who sell alcoholic beverages can be especially diligent around prom season to check identification and fail to sell alcohol to anyone who is underage. This includes wait staff at area restaurants. Parents and guardians can make sure their own alcohol at home is locked away so it cannot be borrowed for prom celebrations.

• Beef up police patrols. Community leaders can work with local police departments to increase patrols around schools and locations that are frequent meeting spots for teenagers following prom festivi-



ties. Law enforcement can respond quickly to parties and other concerns if they devote specialized underage drinking details for prom night.

• Keep parties age-appropriate. Parents in the community can keep prom nights safer by not serving or allowing alcohol at any party they are hosting.

• Safe after-party fun: Recreational centers, churches and other businesses can offer to host after-parties that are monitored and/or chaperoned. This enables teens to gather at safe locations and continue to celebrate in ways that are age-appropriate, without feeling the pressure to attend less trustworthy events.

• Talk about risky behaviors. Parents, teachers and community leaders can talk to teens about the potentially dangerous behaviors present on prom night. Remind teens they always can come to an adult without the risk of being punished if they find themselves in an uncomfortable situation. Parents can continue to establish trust so their kids can come to them when they need help or advice.

• Change prom timing. While "prom night" is the standard, prom dances can occur at any time of the day. Schools concerned about after-hours shenanigans can schedule their events earlier in the day when the potential for drinking or other risky behaviors may be less significant.

Community residents can work together to help make prom season safe for all students.



Before you hit the trail, check out DEC's Hike Smart NY webpage (www.dec.ny.gov/outdoor/28708.html) to learn about safety, best practices, preparedness, and the Hiker Responsibility Code. Discover trails less traveled, and visit when trails may not be as busy.

Check the Weather: Check the National Weather Service for current conditions and forecasts for the locations where you plan to recreate. Check both daytime and nighttime temperatures. Expect conditions to be cooler and more exposed on mountain summits.

Mountain Summits: Check the National Weather Service to prepare for summit weather conditions.



Manage your time wisely: Keep in mind, it gets dark early. Be mindful of sunrise and sunset times, and plan accordingly. Start long hikes early to maximize sunlight hours and always bring a headlamp in case you are out longer than expected.

Approximate time of sunset: 7:42 p.m.

Spring conditions: Temperatures and precipitation can be less predictable this time of year.

Plan ahead and prepare by checking the weather report and trail conditions before heading out. Dress for the weather and come prepared with warm layers and rain gear.

Snowmelt and rain can make stream crossings tricky. Be sure to check the local trail conditions before heading out on your adventure. Avoid stream crossings in the event of high, fast-moving water.

Poison ivy and ticks: With the snow melting and the weather warming up, pesky plants and insects have emerged. Visitors should take precautions to minimize contact with dangerous plants and bugs. For more information on tick identification and safety, visit the DEC website. You can also read more on the DEC website about poison ivy identification.

Mountain biking: There are great opportunities for mountain biking in the Catskills. Spring has sprung but remember, the trails are in transition, meaning they are more susceptible to erosion and trail widening. Do your best to avoid riding muddy, wet or icy trails. When encountering patches of mud or ice, ride through the center of the trail to avoid damaging trailside plants and contributing to potential impacts to the trail.



HIDs work similarly to fluorescent bulbs by passing an electric current through an inert gas in a glass cylinder. LEDs are semiconductors that emit light when powered by an electric current. LEDs and HIDs are now used because they are efficient and last longer. These
