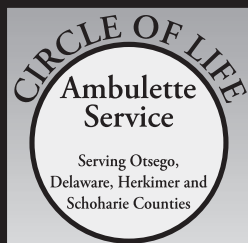

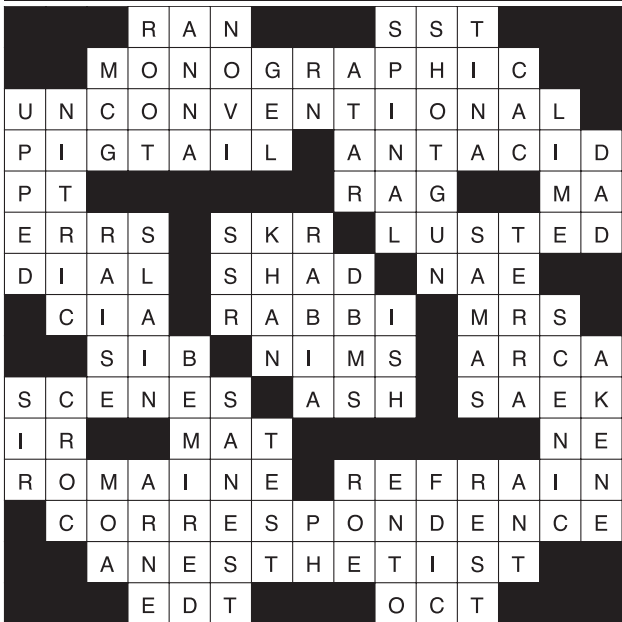

Historic barn rehabilitation tax credit available

New York State Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation announces the availability of the Historic Barn Rehabilitation Tax Credit Program where eligible barns can qualify for a 25% state tax credit against state income tax owed. The amount of the tax credit is equal to 25% of the expenditures incurred to rehabilitate a historic barn. To qualify, a barn must have been built prior to 1946, and the work must be approved by the Division for Historic Preservation. Taxpayers can begin to claim the credit on their 2022 New York state taxes. Governor Kathy Hochul signed legislation reinstating and improving the barn tax credit program, which had been limited in availability due to 2018 federal tax code changes. The legislation was sponsored by State Senator Michelle Hinchey of the 46th District, and Assemblymember Didi Barrett of the 106th District. Program information and staff contact information can be found on the Division for Historic Preservation's website www.parks.ny.gov/shpo/tax-credit-programs/. The Firefighters Association of the State of New York (FASNY) reminds residents to practice safety on a 'staycation' by taking extra precautions to prevent fires and unnecessary injuries.

John Farrell, FASNY president, says with summer around the corner, we are all excited to gather with our friends and family for some much needed relaxation, whether you decide to rent a home or cabin, set up camp at a local site, or make your backyard an oasis, fire safety is paramount.

Renting a home or Airbnb

If you decide to rent a home or cabin, families need to make sure there are working smoke detectors and CO2 alarms throughout the house, said Farrell.

According to a 2019 study by the NFPA, three of every five home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms (40%) or smoke alarms that weren't working (17%). In fires in which the smoke alarms were present but did not operate, more than two of every five (43%) of the smoke alarms had missing or disconnected batteries.

A simple check that your vacation spot has working CO2 alarms and smoke detectors is an important step that can prevent a tragedy, said Farrell.

Further, families may be unfamiliar with the layout of a vacation rental property and may not know the best way to exit in an emergency. Once a smoke detector sounds, there may be less than two minutes to get out safely. Practicing an escape plan will ensure that each person is as prepared as possible. Since most fatal fires happen between midnight and 8 a.m., it is important to be prepared before the emergency occurs.

Camping

New York State has many camping areas to enjoy, said Farrell. If families decide to camp, they should remember to keep fire safety as a priority.

Camping is an enjoyable summer pastime. Before building any outdoor fires, time should be taken to learn how to build one safely, how to control it and how to extinguish it properly. According to the U.S. Forest Service (USDAFS), four out of five forest fires are started by people. Campers should always check with park rangers and local officials to see if campfires are permitted, especially during the

summer when vegetation is dry.

Backyard staycation and barbecue safety

A backyard barbecue is a great way to spend time with family and make a delicious meal. All families should make sure they barbecue safely during the summer months.

A barbecue is a great way to cook for the family, Farrell said, yet people must exercise caution and keep the grill well away from structures and where people are playing or walking.

According to the NFPA, children under five accounted for an average of

that plan to visit this summer should treat their vacation home like their own home. Here are some tips to help practice home fire safety so that you and your loved ones can stay safe this summer.

- Make sure to come up with a plan for everyone in your home. When you walk through your plan, check to make sure the escape routes are clear and doors and windows can be opened easily.
- Have everyone memorize the emergency phone number of the fire department. That way any member of the household can call from a neighbor's home or a cellular phone

once safely outside.

- If there are infants, older adults, or family members with mobility limitations, make sure that someone is assigned to assist them in the fire drill and in the event of an emergency
- Be fully prepared for a real fire: when a smoke alarm sounds, get out immediately. Once you're out, stay out! Under no circumstances should you ever go back into a burning building. If someone is missing, inform the fire department dispatcher when you call. Firefighters have the skills and equipment to perform rescues.

Pool Safety

- Swimming pools are perfect for cooling off in the summer sun. Even though they are fun for the whole family, it only takes a moment for a child (or adult who cannot swim) to drown. All people with pools should make water safety a priority.
- Children should never be left unattended near water and proper fencing should be installed to prevent an accident. When playing in or near a pool, someone should always be watching vigilantly. It only takes a moment.

In the time it takes to reply to a text or turn off the oven, a child can fall into a

pool and drown, said Farrell. All pools should have appropriate barriers to keep children out when adults are not around. When the pool is in use, an adult should be designated to watch in case something goes wrong.

The US Consumer Product Safety Commission states that drownings are the leading cause of unintentional death among children ages 1 to 4 years old. Residential locations made up 71% of the reported fatal drowning incidents.

On behalf of FASNY, we wish everyone a happy, healthy and safe summer, said Farrell.

2022 black bass season open

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) announced that the open (harvest) season for largemouth and smallmouth bass, collectively known as black bass, began Wednesday, June 15, and runs through Nov. 30. The June 15 opener is now the standard opening date for these species, replacing the third Saturday in June. For most of the state, a catch-and-release season exists from Dec. 1 through June 14. Special fishing regulations exist for some waters as outlined in the current fishing regulations guide and should be closely reviewed before heading out to fish.

Delaware County Fair: No headline concert Infrastructure upgrades incomplete

WALTON - The Delaware County Fair will return to Walton Aug. 15-20 with new animal exhibits and updates to facilities. The fair will likely not have completed any projects funded by the \$265,000 allocated from the Delaware County’s American rescue funds.

Jason Craig, fair board secretary, said people can expect to see new exhibits including pony rides and a parakeet exhibit, as well as the return of the kangaroo exhibit due to popular demand.

While there will be no headlining concerts this year, the fair will emphasize free entertainment at the entertainment court which will have performances all week.

Craig said the board of directors is in the process of getting quotes for various projects to be completed with the money allocated from county rescue funds. The projects include waterline upgrades, painting barn roofs, improving the horse barn area and installing covers over the manure pads. Craig said these projects likely will not be started until after the fair.

“We don’t want to start something of that magnitude and not have it done before the fair,” Craig said.

However, people can expect to see repairs to the floor of the beef barn which

was damaged by flooding.

Craig said rising fuel prices and other cost increases will make it more expensive to run the fair this year, and he is concerned that these factors will also cause a decrease in attendance.

“I’m hoping the economy and fuel prices don’t drive people away,” Craig said.

A complete schedule of events is expected to be released the week of June 13. Information will be posted to the fair website - delawarecountyfair.org. Exhibitors can find entry information on the website under the “Entries & Rules” subsection under the “Entries” tab.
