Delaware Valley Agricultural Society / Fair Board President Ed Rossley said guests can expect to see more vendors, new exhibits and old favorites at the fairgrounds this year.

Adventure Family Circus will be performing acrobatics for spectators at the fair. The show will run multiple times each day with high-flying aerial acts, ground acrobatics, trampoline acts, teeter-board acts and

others.

For animal lovers, a parakeet show will be making its fair debut, and due to high demand the petting zoo will return. The zoo will again feature kangaroos and this year, pony rides, too.

The grandstand shows this year will include a memorial 10,000 pound tractor pull dedicated to Ernie Hanselman. Among Hanselman's many passions in life was tractor pulling at the fair. The Thursday night tractor pull will honor Hanselman, who died Dec. 4, 2021, and will include street legal 4x4 gas trucks and 10,000 lb farm tractors. The event begins at 7 p.m. and admission is \$5.

They will be located in the Ag Awareness area, near the end of the dairy barns, beside the milking parlor, where free milk is given away. "We're proud to have them as a sponsor," Rossley said.

## Walton Students Build Fairground Benches

Students from Walton Central School District are leaving their imprint on the fairgrounds this year, having made 30 new benches in a construction class. The new benches will replace the old benches that had deteriorated over the years.

The class, led by Walton CSD teacher Sal Salvia, teaches students the art of construction through projects like making baseball bats, fishing nets, model sheds and a full size shed.

Salvia said this year, he added the bench building as an extra project after being approached by Dan Hodges. Hodges works at the school, but he is also the former fair board president and a fair board member of 30 years.

Hodges said the fair board was looking to replace some benches

that have been worn down, and thought of Salvia's construction class because he recalled making benches for the fair when he was a student at Walton CSD.

"It's just a fun project, and it gets kids involved with the fair," Hodges said.

The board bought the supplies from Ren Rest Lumber & Building Supply in Walton for the students to build 30 benches, each five feet long. The old benches were seven feet long, but Hodges said they wanted to save money and space.

Construction began in February and took approximately two months for the students to complete. Salvia said the project was completed through an assembly line method.

"Near the end I can tell that they were getting tired of cutting and assembly, but we did it," Salvia said.





## 4-H Kids raise livestock for show and auction

For many fairgoers, the fair is just one week in August designated for fun rides and fair food, but for the kids showing livestock it is the culmination of months or even years of hard work.

"There's only two seasons at our house – there's Christmas and there's the fair," Christina Losie said.

Christina's daughters, Madison, 10, and Cadence, 16 of Davenport, both show animals at the fair including chickens, horses, dairy cows, dairy goats, rabbits and pigs.

"Basically in the summer, the Walton fair is my home," Madison said.

Madison first started showing animals at age

three while riding horses and has since expanded to other animals. Madison said that despite the hard work, she enjoys spending time with the animals and with her 4-H friends.

Youth participating in 4-H can enter in a variety of animal exhibits like dairy cattle, beef cattle, dairy goats, meat goats, sheep, swine, horses, poultry, rabbits, cavy (guinea pigs) and dogs.

Judging criteria vary greatly in these shows depending on the animal and the class, but across all exhibits a well-kept and well-behaved animal is essential to success. These two factors do not happen overnight; Madison said it took her a year of training her dairy goat Maize



to get her to walk well on a leadline. She said she starts this process without a halter or rope and first practices getting the goat to follow her by turning their head.

Meat goats require different care and show preparation than the dairy goats, 12-year-old Ashley Madugno from Deposit said

Ashley has been showing meat goats since she

was seven years old, as well as pigs and occasionally, cows. Care for these goats includes feeding twice per day, bathing them once a week, trimming their feet once a week and daily walks. One training trick she does with her young goat, Fez, is to tie him to a fence for five minutes before his walk to train him to keep his head up.

Preparation for a show means clipping the meat goats' coat, trimming their feet and making sure their coat is clean and shining.

"You don't shave (their legs) and you puff it up before you go in the show ring to make it look like they have really big legs," Ashley said. "And then you also leave their tail with a little poof on it."

Other animals, like chickens, have different requirements.

Ella Gerster, 15, from Davenport, shows several animals but especially loves to show chickens. She is a member of Future's Finest 4-H club along with Madison and Cadence Losie. Gerster said to prepare for shows, she washes her chickens with baby shampoo and fabric softener, blow dries them, trims their breaks and clips their toenails.

Gerster enjoys showing chickens so much that she has even organized an extra challenge for the 4-H poultry showmen which tests their knowledge of chicken breeds and anatomy. After being exposed to more advanced poultry

showmanship at other poultry shows, Gerster decided to give other 4-H poultry showmen a similar challenge. She put together a four-page packet which includes an anatomical diagram for people to fill in, a section to fill in information about a specific breed and a breed identification portion.

Animals are generally cared for and trained by the kids, although many also receive help from their parents.

For many kids showing livestock, the hobby is a family tradition with older siblings, parents and grandparents having participated as children.

"When I'm here I take care of them, but normally when I'm at school my mom takes care of them," nine-year-old Addy Olsen from Bloomville, said.

Addy lives 20 minutes from the property where her cows and goats are kept, but her mom, Jackie, takes her to the farm to help with chores and to practice with the animals when she can. Addy began showing cattle when she was about two years old and now shows dairy cattle, dairy goats and meat goats. She

from her mother who has also shown cows and was in the ring with Addy for her 4-H Cloverbuds debut.

For some kids, this guidance comes from older 4-H members like Ashley's older sister, Autumn Mad-

"She's back here doing whatever she's working on and she'll have six to eight kids around her asking her Madugno, Autumn and Ashley's mother. "She likes letting them know what to do, and she's a good role model because she's serious about what she does."

Autumn has been showing cows since she was

eight years old, and she toward. now owns and shows 11 cows representing seven dairy breeds. She said that along with helping and socializing with other people at the shows, she enjoys having something to work

"It's something I look forward to, it's having a project and just having something to grow on every year," Autumn said.



# Feathered Fairgoers Welcomed Despite Prior Bird Flu Concerns

Richard Ball, New York State Agriculture Commissioner, lifted a ban June 3 which had put a hold on poultry shows, exhibitions, auctions, sales, meets and swaps. With the ban lifted, poultry exhibits at the fair will be free to resume as usual.

The ban was originally put in place March 25 after four flocks in the state became infected with highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI), also known as bird flu. Restrictions were tightened April 14 because four more flocks became infected even after the original ban, bringing the total up to eight infected flocks this year.

The ban was lifted as cases of bird flu decreased nation-wide and in the state. The last infected flock in New York was reported April 6. While humans can become infected with bird flu, it is extremely rare with only

one case ever being confirmed in the U.S., according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Fairgoers can view a variety of poultry species and breeds in the livestock barn including chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys and peacocks. The livestock barn also holds goats, sheep, pigs, rabbits and guin-


The 4-H poultry show will take place Tuesday at 3 p.m., and there is also a 4-H rooster-crowing contest Friday at noon. At the 4-H Youth Building, fairgoers can visit the egg incubator and may even see baby chicks hatching.

ea pigs.

While people are free to bring their flocks to poultry shows, the New York State Department of Agriculture encourages people to exercise caution. The recommendations include clean-

ing transportation crates between uses, not sharing supplies with other exhibitors, isolating birds from the rest of the flock 21 days after returning from the show and washing hands before and after handling birds. Poultry must not come to the fair if they are showing any signs of illness. Symptoms of bird flu in poultry include sudden death, reduced egg production, misshapen eggs, lethargy, reduced appetite, respiratory symp-

toms

ans organizations, rescue squads, law enforcement, high school marching bands, youth groups, local businesses and other local organizations.





At 1 p.m., the hitched classes - including a sixhorse hitch class named after Don Perry, long-time draft horse show director

are scheduled to begin, junior driving classes, farm team classes, single and tandem classes - and exhibitors will demonstrate how draft horses pull wagons or vehicles."

In this area the best known breed is the Belgians, but judges know the special characteristics of every draft breed. These gentle giants will be judged on specialized points as described on the show schedule and their ability to work while hitched as a single entry or as part of a team.

To observe the power of draft horses are, be sure to visit the horse show ring Friday night starting at 6 p.m. for the New York State Draft Horse Pullers Association Horse Pull. Pairs of draft horses - either lightweight or heavyweight are hooked to a weighted sled. The horses must pull the load 27 and 1/2 feet for the pull to qualify. Each team gets three tries to pull the weight the required distance. After each heat, weight is added to the sled until a winner is announced in each category.






