



Grant for workers with disabilities

The Workforce Development Board of Herkimer, Madison and Oneida Counties (WDB/HMO) has received a nearly \$3 million grant from the U.S. Department of Labor. How to modernize your résumé

Since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic more than two years ago, businesses, especially small firms, have struggled to find employees to fill vacancies within their companies. A survey from CNBC/Survey Monkey released in May 2022 indicated that 52 percent of small business owners reported it had grown more difficult to find qualified people over the previous 12 months.

The difficulty many businesses are having in regard finding qualified applicants can be seen as a great opportunity by skilled professionals looking for a new job. Qualified job seekers can take advantage of the lack of competition to land their dream jobs. Prior to beginning a new job search, seasoned professionals might want to consider some strategies to modernize their résumés and improve their chances of finding a dream job.

• **Reconsider your résumé template.** If it's been awhile since you looked for a new job, chances are strong the design of your résumé could be viewed as outdated. Jobscan.co/ resume-templates offers a host of Microsoft Word-compatible free résumé templates. These templates are categorized, with some specifically for senior- and executive-level positions and others based on how job seekers want to list their skills and experience (i.e., chronological, hybrid, etc.).

• **Prominently display your abilities.** The job-seeking experts at Jobscan

indicate that the average recruiter spends around six to seven seconds glancing at a typical résumé before deciding if an applicant could be a good fit. With such little time to make a strong first impression, applicants will want to emphasize their skills at the top of their résumés. Recruiters and human resources professionals who see an attractive skillset might then be compelled to explore the document further to determine how those skills were acquired.

• **Avoid information overload.** If HR professionals and recruiters are only spending a few seconds scanning each résumé, applicants will want to keep job descriptions short and sweet. Condense responsibilities into bullet points, ideally using just a single line for each point. Avoid listing too many bullet points for each job, as that could affect the likelihood that the résumé will get more than a passing glance.

• **Remove outdated information.** The online jobs resource Indeed notes that seasoned professionals who have been with their current employers for more than five years can remove certain sections on a résumé. Sections like internships, awards received early in a career, volunteer gigs from years ago, and pre-college educational background do not need to be listed on experienced professionals' résumés.

Now could be a good time for experienced professionals to look for a new job. The first step in a successful job search could be modernizing a résumé to more closely reflect where candidates are in their careers.

How to build and maintain a strong credit rating



A strong financial history benefits consumers in myriad ways. Individuals with a history of paying their bills on time and avoiding significant consumer debt may be eligible for lower interest rates on big ticket items like homes and automobiles, potentially saving them tens of thousands of dollars over their lifetimes.

Though there are many ways to build a strong financial history, avoiding debt is always part of that equation. Credit scores are used to determine consumers' creditworthiness in the eyes of lenders and can affect eligibility for loans and the terms of those loans. Understanding credit scores and how to build and maintain a good credit rating can be vital to individuals' financial futures.

What is a credit score?
A credit score is a three-digit number between 300 and 850. The higher the number, the better an individual's credit rating is. The lower the number, the less creditworthy consumers become in the eyes of lenders.

What is the average credit score?
According to Equifax, which along with Experian and TransUnion is one of three credit reporting agencies, the average credit score in the United States in February 2021 was 698. Credit scores in Canada range from 300 to 900, and TransUnion reports the average score in Canada is around 650.

Is 698 or 650 good?
There's good news and bad news for Canadian and American consumers. The average rating in each country falls into the "Fair" (Canada) or "Good" (United States) range. However, consumers should aspire for scores that are higher than the average in both countries. A credit score above 720 is considered "Excellent," and the online financial resource Nerd Wallet reports that individuals with scores above 750 are in even better shape. Such individuals may have access to financial products or be eligible for loan terms that people with lower scores are not privy to. Making the most of those advantages can save consumers consider-

able sums of money over the course of their lifetimes and may help them build the type of generational wealth millions of people aspire to.

How can individuals achieve high credit scores?
The best way to build and maintain a high credit score is to understand the factors that influence that score. FICOTM is a data analytics firm that provides credit scoring services. Equifax notes that FICO scores consider five categories from individuals' credit histories:

• Payment history

• Amounts owed

• Length of credit history

• New credit accounts

• Mix of credit used

Each of these categories are weighted, and none bears more significance than payment history. Consumers who have demonstrated an ability to pay their bills on time and limit the amounts of debt they carry at any given moment are doing themselves a favor as they look to achieve and maintain a high credit rating.

Is all debt the same?
It's important that consumers distinguish consumer debt from student loan debt. Though each type of debt will be reported to the three major credit bureaus, student loan debts that are paid on time each month are generally considered "good debt" because they demonstrate an individual's ability to make installment payments on time over a significant length of time. That's what consumers will need to do if they hope to purchase a home in the future and finance it with a mortgage loan.

Unlike student loans being repaid in installments, consumer debts like credit card balances must be paid in full each month for consumers to avoid potentially hefty interest charges. Consumers who can't pay those balances in full each month are not demonstrating creditworthiness in the eyes of lenders, and that will have an adverse effect on their credit ratings.

Understanding credit and how to build and maintain a strong rating is vital to individuals' financial futures.

18th annual Cauliflower Festival Sept. 24

The 18th Cauliflower Festival will be held Saturday, Sept. 24 from 11 to 4 in Margaretville's Village Park, sponsored by the Central Catskills Chamber of Commerce.

Pure Catskills, the Catskill Forest Association and the Historical Society of Middletown will be key components of the family-friendly festival which also features many community organizations, vendors and artisans.

Food – from barbecue and cauliflower specialties, to take-home produce – will top the festival ‘menu.’ Performing from noon to 3 will be a festival favorite, blues guitarist and vocalist Mike Hermann.

In the CFA Tent of Knowledge, Dr. Michael Kudish, noted Catskills’ forest historian, will speak at 12:30 on “Sawmills, piano bars, log roads, sugar maple distribution, and first growth forest.” At 1:30, the NYS DEC’s Bryan Ellis will discuss “Forest carbon and the impacts of climate change on New York forests,” followed at 2:30 by Lindsay Baxter of Cornell University on “Lyme and other tick-borne diseases of the Northeast.”

Agricultural and community history exhibits will be found in the HSM History Tent. This year’s display will focus on farm-based boarding houses.

At 1:30 p.m., folklorist Ginny Scheer will lead a conversation on that topic with several individuals whose families either operated or visited these once ubiquitous tourist havens. HSM will share photos and artifacts from the cauliflower growing industry

which flourished in the Catskills from the 1890s through the 1950s.

The Catskills Conquest Endurance Run for vintage automobiles will again make the Cauliflower Festival a stop on their route from Mt. Tremper along the Catskill Mountains Scenic Byway. The run commemorates a 1903 test of endurance among early car makers and drivers who traversed the Catskills along what is now NYS Route 28. Cars are due to arrive around 11 a.m.

2020 Census data shows decline in DelCo youth population

Delaware County's has reduced by 3,672 resi-dents, or 7.7%, since 2010, according to the 2020 Cen-sus. Adults age 18 or older made up 82.5% of the pop-ulation in 2020, a decline of 5.3% from 2010. The youth population has declined by 17.5% since 2010, the cen-sus reports, from 19.6% in 2010 to 17.5% in 2020.

The youth population has declined in each town in Delaware County, aside from Delhi, which saw a youth population increase of 1.4% since 2010, according to the Census. Youth in Andes, in 2010, accounted for 14.7% of the popula-tion, but in 2020, only 11% of the population were youth-aged, reflecting a 35.6% decline in youth population since 2010.

Most towns saw an over-all population decline, though Bovina had a pop-ulation increase of 3.9% since 2010. Deposit expe-rienced the largest decline in population with a 16.6% decrease since 2010, ac-cording to the Census.

The population change is also reflected in housing statistics; the 2020 vacancy rate for Delaware County was 35.9%, including sea-

sonal occupancies. In 2020, the Census reported 29,953 total housing units in the county, with 19,193 occupied, and 10,760 vac-ant; a 5% increase in vac-ant homes from 2010.

Andes had the high-est vacancy rate in 2020 of 56%, with 582 of 1,322 housing units in Andes oc-cupied, and 740 vacant.

Race and ethnicity pop-ulation changed only slight-ly in Delaware County: White, 87.6%, Hispanic or Latino, 4.5%, Black (Non-Hispanic) 2.3%, Asian (Non-Hispanic) 1.1%, Two or more races (Non-Hispanic) 4.0%, Other race, 0.6%. The population of residents who reported to be two races or more in-creased by 238.8% since 2010, from 1.1%, the Cen-sus reported.


