COVID-19 Frontline Fighters: *A heartfelt thanks to our community's heroes*

Not all heroes wear capes. In fact, the coronavirus pandemic has shown us that many of our heroes are everyday people—our neighbors, our fellow churchgoers, our friends, our family, our high school classmates. These ordinary people, working often underappreciated jobs, leveled up when COVID-19 made its way to Emanuel County. This “COVID-19 Frontline Fighters Edition” is to serve as a thank-you for the lifesaving work that took place here over the last few weeks. This is only a small gesture compared to what these heroes deserve, but there would be no way to appropriately scale up the amount of recognition they have earned.

When the news of coronavirus reached our small community, panic ensued almost immediately. Grocers had monumental difficulty keeping the shelves stocked due to the demand from shoppers. Food and cleaning products became increasingly harder to find as the early days trudged on, and N95 masks were nearly impossible to find. The panic level lowered a bit in the next phase of COVID-19, but not enough to warrant a rest for the local grocery stores, their workers, and the innumerable maskmakers who broke out their sewing machines to fill the void.

On April 1, Emanuel County recorded its first case of COVID-19. Thankfully, our local nursing homes, healthcare providers, and hospital had prepared accordingly ahead of the virus reaching our area. The total number of cases peaked at 27 on May 19. By the grace of God alone, our percentage of cases stayed considerably low, given the fact Emanuel County had, as of press time for this publication on Friday, May 22, tested a whopping 523 patients. Unfortunately, we suffered two deaths. Our mortality rate is impressively low as well compared to larger areas, but in the small community we live in where everyone knows everybody and love abounds, those are two deaths too many. I am not afraid to venture to say that number would be higher if it weren't for the sound advice given to our confirmed positive cases by our health professionals who treated these cases, the common sense and goodwill for our fellow man demonstrated by everyone who socially distanced themselves throughout the duration of this pandemic, and, most importantly, the prayers lifted by all believers here and the vast amount of grace given to us by the ultimate healer.

Though many of the essential occupations are represented in these pages, let us not forget just how important the ones not shown in this publication are as well. We would run out of newsprint trying to thank everyone who has played a part in seeing us through. We chose these select few because without them, our society would've stopped altogether.

The nurses, doctors, techs, and receptionists who kept our healthcare services afloat—their work is a given. Without their helping hands, selfless attitudes despite hot layers of PPE, and their compassion cannot be overappreciated. They continued to go to work every day and care for those who needed it most despite knowing the risk, and they did it without complaint. Our EMS workers, firefighters, police, and state troopers did the same, all in the name of keeping us safe. Our bank managers and tellers kept our monetary needs fulfilled, and our funeral homes answered the call to service for the many families who lost loved ones. Our educators came up with new and innovative ways to keep the learning process going in the wake of school's cancellation for the remainder of the year, and Emanuel County Schools' Nutrition Department delivered umpteen lunches to keep those students fueled and ready to learn remotely. Our linemen kept the power on, 911 kept dispatch going, and the pharmacies continued meeting the medicinal needs of our community. All the while, our retailers, fast food restaurants, gas stations, vet clinics, and other businesses adjusted their practices to remain open, help their customers, and keep alive a sense of normalcy during these strange times.

Now that we're seeing the light at the end of the tunnel, it is only fair to pay thanks to everyone who helped keep our world turning. As coronavirus waged war on us, these faces—some of whom you may recognize while others you may not—were on the frontlines. We made it because of them. When you see an essential worker out and about, express your gratitude. Buy them a cup of coffee. Ask them to pray with them for strength and perseverance as we inch closer to COVID-19 waving a white flag. Make them smile. These are only little things in the grand scheme of how we should repay them, but little things matter all the same.

Last but not least, as we move forward, may we carry the lessons we've learned during this pandemic with us tomorrow. We should never forget or dismiss the physically and mentally draining labor these workers put in. We should always remember to prioritize faith over fear, just as the crosses that remain standing in our yards tell us to do, and we should always know in our hearts that being kind is an act that is never fruitless. We should always know that we're stronger together, even if it means we have to be alone as we unify, and God will see us through even the most intimidating moments in time.
