## New source of energy? 20-acre solar farm proposed for Pine Bush

By the end of 2017, solar energy may be available to 500 Pine Bush homes and businesses who lack solar technology,

according to John Reagan, zoning manager for development for Cypress Creek Renewables, based in Santa Monica, California. He appeared before the Town of Crawford Planning Board with a preliminary plan for a 20-acre two

megawatt solar farm at 2208 State Route 52 in Pine Bush, which the company has leased. The company aims to make use of state incentives through NYSEDA for such solar farms, as New York heads for

## \$3 million solar farm for Montgomery

A renewable energy company is looking to create a 2-megawatt solar farm on Lake Osiris Road in Montgomery—an approximately \$3 million project.

“It’s a good proposal and we know how to do it,” said Anne Waling of Cypress Creek Renewables during a presentation before the Montgomery Planning Board on Monday.

Waling said the California-based company has over 3 gigawatts of local solar farms deployed or in development (that’s enough to power approximately 750,000 homes, according to CCR).

However the company is not looking to create a large commercial solar farm, but what Waling called a “boutique” farm with 9-15 acres of panels. The driveway, fencing and other items would be placed on the remainder of the 20 acres they are leasing, which will avoid the wetland areas on the property.

The panels would be located in two areas, with most of the panels placed in the back portion of the parcel after the currently wooded area has been cleared.

Planning Board Chairman Fred Reichle said the extent of the clearing (8-12 acres) will be a concern moving forward, especially with its impact on stormwater management.

Another concern will be the effect on the adjacent Walden-Wallkill Rail Trail, across which the initial proposal also suggests an access.

“What it looks like from the Rail Trail will be the biggest concern,” said Reichle.

Waling said the company intends to place an evergreen buffer screening the

# VC-Wallkill eye joint bus contract

A new transportation contract for the Valley Central School District could be on the horizon, as the school board announced at its meeting on Oct. 24 that the district has received its Request For Proposal agreement with the Wallkill Central School District. Valley Central's attorney and insurance company have reviewed the 165-page document, which will allow the district to go out for bid for a joint bus contract with Wallkill.

The districts hope to obtain a favorable bus deal by teaming up, but the compact will also give local transportation companies the option to bid on the districts individually if they choose. "When we decided to work with Wallkill, one of the things we spoke about was that when the project goes out on the street people can bid on both districts together, or if they're not interested they could just do Valley Central or just do Wallkill," Superintendent John Xanthis said. "The whole point of that is not to preclude anybody from wanting to bid. If they think two districts is too big, they could do Valley Central separate or Wallkill. So it gives a lot of different options. Hopefully that will bring more people to put a bid in and makes it more competitive."

The existing Valley Central bus contract dates back 36 years, and with both districts currently looking for new deals the timing was right to combine forces and to find out if a joint deal makes economic sense. Bids could start rolling in by the end of the year for the potential new contract.

Last Monday's meeting began with a presentation of seventh grade classes from the middle school who took part in this year's Day in the Life of the Hudson River event. The students traveled to the Beacon Landing on Oct. 20 to participate in the statewide program, which gives kids an educational look at the mighty river. "Every year the science department goes on the trip, I remember my daughter going to the Hudson River," Board of Education President Sheila Schwartz said. "They have a good time. They do the pH balance and they collect the data throughout the year. Then they use that for all of their science projects and labs throughout the year. They come back and use the data compared to the textbooks."

The students got an up-close look at the aquatic habitat by catching fish and determining their species. Seventh graders Jenna Mohr and Elizabeth Nalley

arrived at the board presentation decked out in their fishing gear, and the older students explained that they took on a leadership role with the younger class after getting their feet wet in the program last fall. "The eighth graders who got to do it last year felt a lot more confident this year," Xanthis said. "I think one of the big buzzwords in education is cooperative learning. So they're out there, and they're mentoring the seventh graders. Just being out there, and seeing science and how it works, it's a great day for our kids. I'm really appreciative of the middle school teachers taking the opportunity and the time out to take these kids down there. It's a great experience."

The Hudson River estuary program attracts more than 3,000 students each year to 80 locations up and down the river, as kids from New York City to the Albany region get a chance to share a common purpose for a day through nature. "It's a fabulous opportunity for the kids to get out and get real life experience," Board Vice President Sonia Lewis said.

District pupils will soon have a new platform to show off their performance skills, as the Village of Montgomery is opening up its bandstand to host a slew of potential student activities. The village board has invited the district to utilize the bandstand for plays, choral presentations, art shows, science fairs or any inventive way school groups can dream up to use the public space. "Jane Samuelson informed us that they would like to expand the use of the bandstand and would like to get the school district

involved," Xanthis said. "That was the offer, and we got the information out to all the buildings, so hopefully now they'll be having conversations. It's not just for the holiday season, it'll be all year. We have some creative people here in the district, so I'm sure people will come up with ways for the kids to perform or show off their work outside of what normally happens in a school district."

In September, the district teamed with the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Council of Orange County to present a Hidden Mischief drug awareness event about the possible hiding places a drug-addicted teen could conceal narcotics. The district has now announced two more parent workshops that will take place in the next six weeks, with a program entitled Medicine Cabinet up next on Nov. 16 at 6 p.m. in the middle school cafeteria.

The presentation will include ADAC Executive Director Jim Conklin and reps from the Assistant District Attorney's Office and Orange County Chemical Dependency Services, as the panel will explain how students become addicted to drugs such as heroin after initially getting hooked on prescription pills. The second session, Parents who Host Lose the Most, will be held on Dec. 14 at the same location and time, and will focus on the dangers of underage drinking and the perils of parents allowing teens to hold underage drinking parties in their homes. All of the drug prevention programs are free and residents from any district are welcome to attend.

## Town tax levy may increase by 4.7%

The Town of Montgomery budget looks to be in "okay shape" for 2017, said Township Supervisor Michael Hayes, after a recent budget workshop. "But it depends what happens next quarter. We budgeted the right amount, I think. Last year it was about the same."

However, he anticipates a 4.7% levy increase, requiring a tax cap override, as this year's state tax cap is .68%. Some expenses, particularly health insurance and workman's compensation will be higher. Those costs will not be determined until the fourth quarter, and they could affect the levy, he said.

Health insurance could be up 18%, he noted, but since the town budgeted for a 16% increase, if the increase is less, the tax increase could be less, since health insurance is a big budget item.

"But the extra money could also just be moved around," he said.

Sales and mortgage taxes will also be determined in the fourth quarter and can affect the tax rate, Hayes said, especially since the gas tax has been down and the number of refinances is still an unknown.

To keep tax increases down, most

requests for new equipment have been denied, he said, including police requests for two new cars with updated equipment. However, as the animal control truck is developing rust, its condition may necessitate replacement, he said.

The proposed budget gives town elected officials and non-union employees a 2% raise, including town supervisor, town clerk, and town highway superintendent, said Hayes, although the town board chose not to take the raise.

Police Chief Arnold Amthor has also asked for two part time animal control staff, as currently just one person is on call at all times.

Mark Hoyt, town councilman, estimated that the tax increase would, on average, cost residents about fifty dollars yearly.

On November 3, the town board will have a public hearing on the budget, Hayes said. On November 17, the board will vote on the state tax cap override and may also vote on the budget. If a special board meeting is necessary for the budget, that would be on November 17, as the budget must be passed by November 20.

property from view. She also pointed out that the farm will not need a substation because of its smaller size and the power generated will go to a distribution line by the road rather than a transmission line.

Cypress Creek Renewables will also sell the energy themselves to local residents. She estimated that the farm will generate enough power for 300-600 homes and promised that residents who sign a contract with the company will see an immediate rate savings.

Waling explained the project opened up solar energy and its cost savings to individuals who want to be environmentally friendly but may rent or do not want to install expensive solar panels on their roof.

"It's hard for us to review what we don't know," said Reichle, pointing out that they didn't have enough of an application to review the project.

Waling promised to begin work on the necessary forms and soil testing and coordinate a site visit for a couple members of the Planning Board.

In other business, the Planning Board approved the site plan, special use permit and negative declaration as to SEQRA for Campbell Freightliner following the conclusion of its public hearing.

The Campbell Freightliner project is located at the corner of Route 208 and

Henry Henning Drive and will entail a great deal of changes, starting with the addition of approximately 22,331 square feet to the existing structure, currently occupied by Quality Towing and a Subway restaurant. The completed structure will be solely for the use of Campbell Freightliner and entail office space, sales counter, parts storage, truck service bays and bathrooms.


The site will also have truck service bays, a vehicle wash bay, dynamometer bay, warehouse space and expanded customer waiting areas and parking.

The approvals were conditioned on the new signage for the site meeting the town's code.

The board also approved the application of Chili Gas, located on Stone Castle Road, following its public hearing. The owner of the business, which stores and distributes liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), hopes to be up and running by Jan. 1. The approvals were conditioned on meeting lighting requirements and submitting the necessary stormwater management paperwork for an MS4 community.

A lot line change for Ted Haines, who is purchasing approximately 390 feet of land from his neighbor, will be on the board's agenda at their meeting on Nov. 14. The planning board waived a public hearing.

# PB gathers data for supt. search

What the Pine Bush community wants in their next school district superintendent emerged in a meeting at Pine Bush High School on Oct. 20. Honesty, integrity, and communication skills were the three qualities the Pine Bush community rated as most essential for a school district superintendent on a recent district website survey by Educational Legacy Planning Group. But NLPG Principal Robert Hendriks III wanted to give the community a chance to discuss their opinions, as superintendent candidates step forward. Already 35 have applied from all over the country, he said.

So Hendriks led a community meeting that drew about 70 people to Pine Bush High School on Thursday night. In the multi-step process of choosing the next superintendent, as guided by ELPG, groups that mixed teachers, administrators, staff, and community members gathered at cafeteria tables to formulate responses to three questions: What qualities does Pine Bush need in its next superintendent? Give a detailed description of the next Pine Bush superintendent. Write one measureable, achievable goal the next superintendent can achieve in the next three years.

One table included two school principals, a teacher, a teacher's assistant, and a parent. They discussed whether the superintendent should live in the community to be "invested" in it. First grade teacher Theresa Salvato said that, for her, living in Pine Bush meant that students saw her in different contexts, whether dressed for church or in sweat pants to work out—and that could be good.

Brian Breheny, Pakanasink Elementary School

principal said the superintendent should be "forward thinking with an awareness of the past."

A willingness to seek out and try new strategies, whether with technology or the use of desks where students stand rather than sit, is important to Eric Winter, Pine Bush Elementary School principal. He also noted the importance of "maintaining and growing programs."

"You see lots of programs at the high school level. You can have them at the elementary school too," he said, including programs to "keep kids connected with schools," to improve graduation rates and college enrollment.

Tom Druke, parent of a student in Circleville Elementary and one in Circleville Middle School, wanted to make improving graduation rates a three-year goal.

Toward that end, Winter suggested the importance of varied instructional programs, from Advanced Placement classes to Academy programs that have students working outside school at sites related to their career interests.

Each table put their answers together on a single sheet and one person from the table read their answers to the group. Their answers ranged from generalities to specifics. Participants wanted a superintendent who has "humility." They wanted someone to connect schools with businesses and the community. And one group suggested connecting schools with each other by having pen pal programs between them that culminate in a picnic.

Other group suggestions for superintendent goals included finding ways to reduce remediation, whether in summer school or AIS, or by repeating classes. Another suggestion was to have students explain their career path at an exit interview before graduation.

Hendriks attributes much of a superintendent's ability to succeed to their ability to work with the school board, he said.

"Kids don't get anything without the school board," he said. "Superintendents know they can't accomplish anything without a good board. When a board supports a multi-year planning process, that says to the superintendent, 'I can do great things.' A dysfunctional school board history won't attract a superintendent."

Hendriks also emphasized the importance of a superintendent's ability to manage their administrative cabinet, who in turn work with middle management.

"It's about relationships and shepherding a vision."

The board was scheduled to begin interviewing semi-finalists on November 1, and then finalists later in the month, Hendriks said.

# 20-acre solar farm proposed for Pine Bush

50 percent renewable energy use by 2030, Reagan said.

The company would sell electricity to individuals, businesses, and the town at rates below current consumer cost, he said. The soonest the project would be complete would be winter of 2017, but may not be finished until 2018.

"We're in early planning stages of assessment and development," he said, for solar farms primarily in Orange, Sullivan, and Ulster counties, and "less far along" in Dutchess County and central New York.

"We haven't built solar farms in New York State yet," Reagan said.

A site plan for the Pine Bush site may be ready for the December planning board meeting, he said.

The farm would consist of 8000 solar panels with an inverter panel to convert energy to AC.

In his discussion with the planning board, town attorney Ben Gailey said a survey would need to be done before the site plan, and the farm would need buffers and setbacks from streams and wetlands. Like a power plant, seven to eight foot fencing would be required. Wires should be below ground as much as possible, and wires that are above ground would require justification. Since Route 52 is a state scenic byway, a visual impact assessment will also be necessary.

Gailey disclosed that his law firm represents Borego Solar.

## Decade Old Strip Mall Plan Re-emerges

A site plan for a strip mall that Crawford Planning Board approved a decade ago resurfaced at the planning board meeting and was re-approved. Collabar Courts, LLC, had previously put aside the plan for a Route 17K site in Bullville because of the weak economy, said their representative, Zachary Peters, principal at Mercurio, Norton, Tarolli, and Marshall Civil Engineering and Land Surveying.

He presented a version of the plan revised to meet new storm water regulations established by New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. The proposed plan includes 20,500 square feet for office, retail and restaurant use on Route 17K in Bullville.

"It's a good spot on 17K for commercial use," Peters said of its location between the five corners intersection of routes 302 and 17K and Lybolt Road in Bullville and Montgomery. "There's nothing between that and Montgomery, and it's accessible. There's been interest."

However, he added, "The owners will wait to see who might want space in the project before they decide how or if to build."

The planning board issued a re-approval of the site plan that will be good for one to two years, Peters said.

The building layout is the same, he said, but now storm water must be treated with a bio-retention filter

to remove potential contaminants before it runs into a pond.

"The DEC is more stringent about getting water filtered and back into the ground, because of the lack of water in the aquifer and wells," Peters said. "But there's

no substantial cost difference. We put sandy soil into a depression, and water comes into the pond filtered. There's more site specific source control instead of letting water run to the river."

# Larkin faces Eachus in state Senate rematch

Longtime state Senator Bill Larkin Jr. faces Orange County Legislator Chris Eachus in a rematch for the 39th District seat of the New York State Senate.

The two faced one another in 2012, when Larkin won with slightly more than 50 percent of the vote. The Republican state senator seeks a 14th term. Eachus, a Democrat, currently represents the Town of New Windsor in his third term as a member of the Orange County Legislature.

"As I go door to door, people tell me they are tired of the way things are in Albany - between corruption, higher taxes every year and politicians not doing their job at all," Eachus said in an interview with the Mid Hudson Times last week. "These folks want a change, need a change and I'm that change."

Eachus is running on Democratic, Working Families and Women's Equality Party lines. A teacher for 30 years, he taught physics, astronomy and earth science at Marlboro High School. Eachus retired as a physics

teacher at NFA last year. He currently serves as an advisor for the NFA Solar Racing Team, which won national high school championships in 2000 and 2007.

Larkin is running on Republican, Conservative, Independence and Reform Party lines. Before running for the Senate seat in 1990, he served as Town of New Windsor Supervisor and state assemblyman. Larkin, 88, is a retired U.S. Army Lt. Colonel, and a WWII and Korean War veteran.

"My focus is working on making the Hudson Valley a more affordable place for families and businesses, while ensuring the region continues to see its fair share of state education funding and transportation aid," wrote Larkin in an email this week.

"I am also focused on making college more affordable for middle class families, doing more to address the heroin epidemic spreading through our communities and reducing poverty and local crime rates."

## Taxes and unfunded mandates

Eachus, 60, is running on platforms including property-tax relief and increased funding for schools. Eachus was

asked how he planned to reduce taxes while at the same time provide more school funding, typically taken out of property taxes.

"We're going to start by putting a tax circuit breaker on," Eachus said. "A circuit breaker means everyone across the state will pay a small percentage of taxes on their income. That ultimately reduces the pot of money. How do we enlarge that pot? We take away the millionaire and billionaire tax exemption on yachts and planes."

In New York, Eachus said, wealthy people "pay no taxes out of those purchases," while the average person who buys a house or car pays a full set of taxes. "What I'd like to see happen are taxes based solely on income," he said. "If you go to a purely, income-based tax system, more people participate."

Eachus pledged to work to eliminate unfunded mandates, which he says cripple local budgets and drive property taxes higher.

"The big one is this ridiculous occurrence of multiple primaries," he said. "If you can reduce them down to a single day, you will have better turn out and a better read on the particular proposition. It's a lot of money for school districts to have to support multiple primaries."

And, the state should pick up the full cost of Medicaid instead of "passing it along the county," said Eachus.

## The water crisis

Both Eachus and Larkin attended a public meeting on perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) contamination of the City of Newburgh drinking water supply at the

Newburgh Armory Unity Center last Tuesday. "From the beginning, many of us joined forces and said, 'Not only do we want blood tests, we want well tests,'" Larkin said at the meeting.

"When this crisis began, I reached out immediately to the DEC and Department of Health, urging them to take action on conducting blood tests for residents and installing a new water-filtration system for the City of Newburgh," Larkin wrote. "Now, we must remain vigilant in ensuring that state, local and federal officials continue working together to provide outreach and make certain that residents receive all the help, information and support that they need."

Eachus called on state agencies to offer testing to people living outside the City of Newburgh. "I'm writing you to request that the Department of Health allows more residents of the Hudson Valley to (qualify) for free blood testing," Eachus wrote to the state DOH last week.

"I'm taking responsibility for making this issue a regional issue," he said following the meeting. "Everything prior to that was for the City of Newburgh only. I keep saying... this is more than a City of Newburgh problem."

Eachus has also called on the state and federal government to begin treating the retention pond at Stewart Air National Guard Base after testing identified it as the most likely source of the PFOS.

"That water is still flowing out of there," Eachus said, "poisoning" wells and the Moodna Creek watershed where people continue to fish.

Eachus has taken a pro-environment stance on several issues during his tenure in the legislature, including opposing the proposed Pilgrim Pipeline. "The New York State Thruway Authority will benefit by having the pipeline run along the Thruway, that is wrong," he said,

referring to the Thruway Authority serving as lead agency for the project. "You can't have an agency that gets a benefit as a lead agency. I don't feel they should be involved at all."

If elected, Eachus said he will fight for ethics reform and term limits in Albany. Eachus proposes limits of six, two-year terms, or a total of twelve years in the same office. Politicians, like his opponent, become "too entrenched" when holding the same office for too long, he said. "We need new, fresh ideas," he said.

Eachus promises to work to reform campaign-finance practices, ban outside income for state legislators and restrict elected officials from receiving government pensions while still in office. Again, he pointed to Larkin.

Referring to Eachus' proposed term limits and his own 13 terms in the state Senate, Larkin wrote, "I have served my nation and community since I was 16 years old. Helping others is my passion, it is what drives me, it is why I get up and go to work every day. In the past two years, I have accomplished a great deal, including extending the tax cap, passing paid family leave and getting the Veterans' Equality Act signed into law."

Eachus highlighted the fact that Larkin was a no-show at several candidates' forums in recent months. (The senator will be participating in a candidates' forum with Eachus this Saturday on FoxRadio WGN, Larkin aide Brian Maher said Tuesday.)

"We, as candidates, have the opportunity to give our perspectives," Eachus said, claiming Larkin also missed days in the last legislative session. "If you're not there to fight for what your district deserves, you don't get it."

However, recent grants secured by Larkin for projects around the district include a \$150,000 grant to restore the historic Milton Train Station, \$150,000 to construct

the Veterans Memorial Park in the Town of Plattekill, a \$150,000 grant for a boardwalk along the Wallkill River in Walden, and \$200,000 for sidewalk improvements in the Village of Maybrook.

Last month, the Good-Will Fire Department credited a \$250,000 grant from the state Dormitory Authority to Larkin and, in August, City of Newburgh officials said Larkin was responsible for more than \$400,000 needed to pay for the replacement of Lake Drive Bridge.

The 39th Senate District includes towns in Ulster, Orange and Rockland counties, and the City of Newburgh. The general election takes place on Tuesday, November 8.

## Another shooting

**H**alloween parties can be scary, but they aren't supposed to end in tragedy. Downtown Newburgh can be a dangerous place after hours, and this past weekend brought another sad example.

A Halloween party on Broadway ended in more gun violence early Sunday morning. Two young women, one an 18 year-old Newburgh Free Academy student, the other 20 year-old, are dead, and five others were injured when gunfire erupted at 12:43 a.m. Late Monday, police announced a cash reward of up to \$2,500 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of Nija A. Johnson, a murder suspect at the tender age of 17. Two others were arrested and accused of weapons possession and tampering with evidence.

Television trucks began setting up across the street from Newburgh Free Academy before dawn on Monday. Students, teachers and parents are in shock. The city is reeling from another senseless act of gun violence. Imagine being the parent who learns that your child will never return from a Halloween party. Imagine witnessing the all-too-familiar sight of candles, photos and stuffed animals outside another shooting scene.

What's even more disturbing is the fact that there were also minors at this after-hours party. One reporter interviewed a 14 year-old witness at the party and another who said she had been invited, but decided at the last minute not to go.

So what can be done to stem the rising tide of gun violence that continues to undermine the best intentions of those who seek to revitalize the city? Tougher gun laws and more gun buyback programs would probably help, but illegal handguns are still finding their way into the area. Should the city extend the Halloween curfew to adults? Do we really want something akin to martial law? What can be done to keep our children safe?

The reality is that police cannot possibly be everywhere. And no amount of added patrols will eliminate gun violence. Added vigilance on our part won't solve all problems, but it will help.

As always, it begins at home. Underage children shouldn't be out past midnight at unsupervised parties. Parents need to monitor the social media contacts of their children and now whose company they keep.

Bullets have already buried too many young people.

### Teachout vs. Faso: The Congressional Race

John Faso, who is Zephyr Teachout's opponent in the race for the congressional seat once held by Maurice Hinchey (and, more recently, Chris Gibson), makes a big deal of the fact that Teachout has not lived in the 19th CD forever, the way Faso has. A phony issue. The problems facing the 19th are not so different from those facing other parts of the state and the nation as a whole: the obscene concentration of wealth at the very, very top; the need for good jobs and infrastructure repair; the proliferation of fracked gas and dirty oil pipeline proposals, even through a state that has not permitted fracking within its borders; the increasingly dire warming of the planet and need to replace fossil fuels with safe energy; the preservation of basic rights for women; the battle against the power that huge corporations have over the lives of ordinary Americans.

On all these counts, Zephyr Teachout scores high and

John Faso fails miserably. While Faso was making money as a lobbyist for the Pilgrim and Constitution pipelines and arguing in favor of using eminent domain against property owners, and was also working as a lobbyist for predatory payday lenders, Teachout was fighting for the middle and working class and the environment. Faso was a consummate Albany insider—in 2010, his law firm settled an illegal lobbying allegation by paying a half-million-dollar fine. Teachout had the courage and independence to buck the Democratic establishment and challenge Governor Cuomo in the Democratic gubernatorial primary (she carried much of the mid-Hudson). She has been personally endorsed by Bernie Sanders, who is actively supporting her. Meanwhile, Faso has raked in half-million-dollar contributions from at least two hedge fund multimillionaires.

# Standing with Standing Rock

## Part 2

The people of Newburgh cannot drink the water flowing through their city pipes. Some of the people of New Windsor cannot drink the water.

The people of Hoosick Falls, NY, cannot drink the water. The people of Flint, Michigan, cannot drink the water. Utica, NY, has lead in the water. All our local schools are being tested for lead coming from the drinking fountains. Some of the tests are bogus because the night before, the testers run the water for hours to clean the pipes. The village of Maybrook has three municipal water wells within 800 feet of a Superfund site. The wells are tested every three months for VOC's (volatile organic compounds) dump there by Nepera Chemical Company from 1953 to 1967. Ellenville has serious cancer clusters. The list goes on and on.

The slogan adopted by the Native Americans protesting the Dakota Access Pipeline is "Mni Wiconi"

which means, "Water is Life." As I write, yesterday, 117 people were arrested by a militarized police force, including tribal leaders who sat in a prayer circle on land they contend was never ceded by the Sioux Tribe to the US. The protestors have been peaceful and for the most part respectful of the police forces aligned by an emergency decree by the governor of North Dakota. How has it happened that our local police forces have turned into Desert Storm units equipped with ear piercing sound cannons, Humvees, and canisters of pepper spray that look like fire extinguishers?

The Native Americans, over 60 tribes now in attendance, have joined forces to protect their water source, the Missouri River, from potential contamination from a pipeline which will carry more than half a million barrels of oil and oil equivalents per day. They are leading the consciousness of America higher into the understanding of just how precious and fragile clean water resources are, not only for their own tribe, but for all of us. Existing pipelines are breaking almost on a daily basis -- just Google it. The city of Bismarck, North Dakota, protected itself from the threat of contamination by having the pipeline moved south of the city, downstream. From what I can see, the Environmental Impact Study of the short term and long term effects of the pipeline were dodgy and incomplete. Knowledge of the location of Indian burial grounds and sacred sites would

have been a fundamental element of this review. It was not. When the Natives petitioned a court to halt construction long enough to review one such burial ground, the pipeline company pushed ahead over a weekend, digging before the court could act.

The Natives camping on the pipeline easement (until yesterday's forcible removal) were claiming, probably incorrectly, the principle of eminent domain. They are not the only ones misusing it. The pipeline company has used the practice of taking other peoples' lands for their own use on numerous ranches and farms where the owners have refused to sell land to the pipeline company. In Iowa, one of the four states through which the pipeline will run, 14 farmers are suing to protect their land from the use of eminent domain by the private pipeline company, claiming the seizure of their land does not qualify for the "public use" requirement for using eminent domain. The pipeline company is a private, for-profit corporation.

The state has not shown clear title to the land on which the Natives set up a temporary camp. The forcible removal of the peaceful water protectors, with the use of night-sticks and pepper spray and rubber bullets and sound cannons is a distinct overreach of power. I stand with the water protestors: Life is Water and we sure should know that in the Town of Montgomery -- all we have to do is look around and see the poison.



# Gardiner Board appears ready to pierce the tax cap

With little wiggle room provided this year by the state property tax cap, the Gardiner Town Board discussed a tentative budget at a workshop Wednesday afternoon that appears destined to pierce the cap. The current amount to be raised by taxes in the budget, which is in flux, is \$2,091,272, or \$91,777 more than 2016's bill of \$1,999,495. With this year's cap only allowing for a paltry 0.68 percent raise (or \$13,000), the board will have to trim substantial funds from the tentative document to stay under the limit.

The board is expected to approve the budget at its Nov. 10 meeting, but much could change with the numbers before then. "We've scheduled a public hearing to adopt a local law to exceed the tax cap, however if we find we can get money from different areas we weren't familiar with as of today, that number may be lowered," Gardiner Supervisor Marybeth Majestic said. "There is

a chance, if all the stars align, that the town could stay under the tax cap. It's not definite. If we don't exceed the cap, we can rescind the local law."

Last Wednesday's budget meeting was attended by board members Laura Walls and David Dukler, and during the town's second workshop on the 2017 spending plan, the group went line by line through the proposed budget. Town Board members will receive a raise next year, with \$21,059 currently budgeted for the board's collective salary, \$4,000 more than last year's total. The supervisor will receive a \$2,000 raise (up to \$39,614) and a bookkeeper's assistant position might be added at a cost of \$11,700 per year.

The Highway Department budget will tentatively rise to \$1,231,782 (over last year's sum of \$1,083,723 collected in taxes), and Superintendent of Highways Brian Stiscia is requesting a boost of \$19,000 in funds to expand the hours for the agency's clerk. "There will be changes made to this," Majestic said of the budget. "There are

different positions in the town that are being looked at as to whether they'll be full-time or part-time." Stiscia told the board that his clerk is currently stretched thin working limited hours, and discussions will be held about different solutions for fleshing out the job. The town will only budget \$5,000 for salt shed repairs in 2017 after renovating the structure at a cost of \$110,000 earlier this year.

The Gardiner (\$374,877) and Shawangunk Valley (\$135,308) Fire Departments will go up by more than \$6,000 combined next year, while the light district is down \$2,000 and the library and sewer district remain flat. The total refuse and garbage line would go up slightly over last year's budgeted total to \$103,200 (a \$300 increase) and the town will budget an additional \$600 for parks next year. Since the state will not be distributing refunds tied to the cap this year, homeowners will not lose that bonus if Gardiner approves a budget over the state cap.

## Putting a scare into cancer

# Region's dairy farms could be a vanishing breed

Dairy farmers need a place to process their milk every day, or they have to dump it, says Liana Hooded, small farm advocate and organizer. So Orange County dairy farmers are hanging on "by their fingernails" these days, she says, as Elmhurst Dairy, in Queens, the last big dairy processor in the area, closes.

"This is the second year of dairy prices being so low that farmers are not covering production costs, let alone making a profit," Hooded said, noting that dairy prices are set in Wisconsin.

As land prices go up while milk prices sag, she worries that Orange County dairy farmers will sell the land that was known in the 19th Century for rich soil that resulted in rich milk. Dean Ford and Sons Dairy Farm in Westtown sold land to Millennium Pipeline for a gas compressor, horrifying neighbors a few years ago.

Mark Hoyt, of Montgomery Township sold his cows in April after 12 years of dairy farming on rented property. He had been raising crops such as corn, soy, and hay for 20 years, when a nearby dairy farm became available."

"I decided to use crops for cows," he said. When he sold the cows, he had a herd of 70.

"I had a variety of reasons to sell, not just milk prices," he said. "The help was getting old. I needed to make capital investments on big ticket items—the milk tank, the barn cleaner. Everything must work every day, 365 days a year. And my kids weren't interested."

But he concedes, "If prices were high

and I was making money, I wouldn't have gotten out. It's a personal decision. But I don't think you'll see a mass exodus, especially for farmers who have a big investment and kids interested. It depends how long prices are low."

He noticed that his dairy farm was subject to a three-year cycle.

"There would be one good year, one okay year, and then a tank year. But low prices cure low prices, and high prices cure high prices."

However, he has observed changes in dairy farming and its economics that run deeper.

"Government was more involved in pricing, but not now," he said. "People are not drinking so much milk. Milk and meat consumption are going down."

Meanwhile, the industry has migrated westward.

"Idaho took New York's number three spot for milk production in the last couple of months. They have cheap land, labor, and taxes. No one bothers them about the smell."

Before, the top three were California, Wisconsin, then New York. Consequently, Hoyt says, milk processors are moving west.

Meanwhile, Orange County milk needs a home, a place to go every day.

"Farmers have irons in the fire. There aren't many handlers left, but someone will take it," says Hoyt.

Lately his crop prices have also fallen below production costs. He usually grows corn, hay, and soybeans, but not this year. He will focus on corn, which gets a better price. The dollar's strength is a problem for farmers, he says.

"When there's too much out there, and the dollar's strong, it hurts agriculture, because it costs others too much on the world market."

As for his dairy herd, he sold them to an

Amish family.

"That made me feel good," he said.

But he still has a few heifers left. He cut the conversation short to go out and take care of them.



# Thruway Ladies Night benefits Breast Cancer Foundation

From yoga and massage to groceries, gas cards, and co-pays, breast cancer patients can benefit from assorted assistance beyond medical care, says Pari Forood, executive director of Miles of Hope Breast Cancer Foundation. She came to Thruway Sporting Goods in Walden last week to receive a donation check for the foundation from Thruway Sporting Goods, Thruway Fine Wines and Liquor, and Thruway Hardware and Home Center. The trio of stores raised \$383 in a single night, which was Ladies' Night, on October 20.

Most of the money was raised at the sporting goods store, where a Tricky Tray offered twelve prize packages. The Night Eyes Runners package, for instance, included a vest, bracelet/flashlight, and sunglasses, worth a total of \$250.

When Bronwen Concours, project manager for the three stores, decided to hold a fundraiser for a relevant organization during Breast Cancer Awareness Month in October, she found that Miles of Hope is the only regional breast cancer charitable organization, Forood said. That was why they were selected for the donation.

The funds raised will be focused on

the Medical Gap Care Orange County fund for people undergoing breast cancer treatment, said Forood. That fund helps patients pay for heat, electricity, cell phone service, rent, mortgage, and transportation, and also complementary care programs.

"Yoga and music, art, and dance therapy have been shown to enhance recovery from breast cancer," Forood

said, noting that hospitals offer those programs.

"Studies have also been done that show patients' high financial burden in those areas," she said.

The foundation's Medical Gap Care Fund spends \$200,000 a year in the eight counties of the Hudson Valley—Orange, Ulster, Rockland, Dutchess, Putnam, Columbia, Westchester, and Greene, said

Forood. Doctors offices and social service agencies alert the about patients in need.

The foundation, based in La Grangeville, works particularly with St. Luke's Hospital, Forood said.

She noted that while Long Island has the highest incidence of breast cancer, the Hudson Valley is in the middle range. She attributes Long Island's high incidence to detection rather than occurrence, because Long Island women are more likely to get mammograms. Breast cancer that is not detected may metastasize and then appear elsewhere, more difficult to eliminate, she said.

The foundation was started by two Hudson Valley women who observed the dilemmas of breast cancer patients from close-up. Dana Effron, breast cancer survivor, and Cathy Varunok, who lost her sister to the disease, started Miles of Hope Breast Cancer Foundation in 2004 to address overlooked needs.

Forood, who has been with the foundation since its inception, recalls Effron's inspiration.

"She said, 'I don't want to give more to Avon, the American Cancer Society or Komen. I don't know what they do,'" Forood said. "I had just ended one job and took on looking for what was missing in breast cancer patient care."

# Orange County Dairies and their Milk Bottles

Alex Prizgintas is a Junior at the Monroe-Woodbury High School and is exceptionally passionate about local history; transportation (both rail and air), local industry (dairy, bottles and bricks), and the Borscht Belt Hotels of Sullivan County. Already a seasoned lecturer, he has given 17 presentations on three separate topics over the past three years, and on November 15 he will be returning to the Harness Racing Museum in Goshen to discuss the history of Orange County Dairies. To illustrate his topic, Alex will be bringing more than 200 milk bottles from Orange County to share and bring to life the history of dairy farming. “I remember one lecture I gave last year that had in the audience three descendants from local dairy farms, three delivery drivers from various dairies and one very special person, Mrs. Knipp, whose husband was one of the founders of the National Association of Milk Bottle Collectors (NAMBC).” The NAMBC recently awarded Alex the Dannheim Emerging Leader Award for his work in promoting and preserving both the history of dairy farming and their milk bottles.

During the early 1880’s, New York was a dirty city with streets crowded with horses and their manure, discarded oyster shells and other debris. Cows were kept in stables and fed the leftover mash from breweries and the resulting milk was so inferior that it became known as “swill milk.” In 1841 the Erie railroad came through Orange County and with its arrival came the discovery of a vastly superior milk. “The Erie Railroad was just the right thing to quickly deliver milk to New York City which became an instant sensation for NYC residents and as well as a major revenue for the railroad,” explains Alex.

# Valley Central grad helps recovering addicts

While drug addicts hesitate to get help from the addict amnesty program offered by Montgomery Township Police Chief Arnold Amthor, three families have contacted him about addicts in their midst. Amthor has referred them to Dylan McDermott, who graduated from Valley Central High School in 2009 as Student Government Association president and accomplished athlete, already addicted to opioids. Now in recovery after four years of heroin addiction, he is director of client relations for LI Helps Recovery Initiation, founded in January by his friend and fellow recovering heroin addict, Louis Iacona, of Long Island.

Amthor's Facebook post about the amnesty offer attracted McDermott's attention, and he got in touch.

"So far, I haven't worked with anybody from my hometown of Montgomery, which is bittersweet," said McDermott, "because I know people are struggling. People are dying as a result of keeping quiet."

LI Helps provides free of charge intervention services, or what they call "interferences," since they are not licensed. The staff of four, soon to be five, receives funding from out of state treatment programs they advocate "according to individual needs," McDermott says. Treatment is paid for by private insurance or nonprofit rehab, he says.

He and Iacona both said they had been through rehab programs regulated by New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services multiple times without success. Finding them too insular and institutional, they had lasting results when they tried out of state programs that had a more familial feel and more integration with activities outside the facility, McDermott said. Those experiences and their ability to maintain sobriety since then underlay Iacona's interest in starting an addiction intervention program, he said.

However, different treatment approaches work for different people, says Jeff Spitz, executive director of Restorative Management, an outpatient substance abuse treatment center based in Newburgh. "There is no one type of treatment that works for everyone," he says. "Everyone is different, and there are many factors that go into someone's being able to find recovery. While these people found recovery their way, there are also many who have found recovery through treatment in New York State, including state run programs.

But by the time Iacona began recovery at 25, he had been through treatment centers dozens of times. He began taking vicodin, percocets, and oxycontin at 15 and shooting heroin at 17 in Long Island.

"I saw crucial pieces missing in people seeking, achieving, and sustaining recovery," he said. "I knew I could bridge the gap where those pieces were missing."

They travel around the area doing "interferences," convincing addicts to get treatment and then assisting them with choosing and getting into a rehab facility. Once the addict is there, they regularly get updates on their progress. They also connect families with counselors and hold weekly family support meetings and monthly trainings on use of Narcan, an opioid antidote that lay people can carry and administer to revive someone who has overdosed. When the person in treatment is released,

they help decide what the next step should be, intensive outpatient care, sober living, or both, says McDermott.

He says that about 75% of their interventions succeed, and they have conducted hundreds. McDermott recently recalled one of his first "interventions" with a heroin addict.

"The family told me he wouldn't listen. He would be argumentative and possibly even violent. But that's become typical of all families I work with," McDermott said. "I had the family meet me at a diner, where I spoke with them about our plan of action. We created a list of stipulations the individual must comply with."

If he refused rehab, he would be told, the list of repercussions included not being able to live in his family's house, nor would they pay for his car insurance and cell phone.

"When we did the intervention, I approached him in his room, alone," McDermott said. "I immediately defused any confusion by explaining that I'm not a doctor, teacher, therapist, and certainly not his mother or father. I said I'm just a 25 year old kid who's been where he is now. In five minutes, he was crying about his struggles and how he couldn't stop using."

McDermott recently had dinner with the family. But in another recent case, they were unable to convince the addict to get treatment. They stayed in contact with his mother, who had allowed her son to remain at home. He died of an overdose last week, McDermott said.

Orange County has the highest rate of drug overdoses in the state, according to Town of Wallkill Police Chief Robert Hertman, and the overdose rate has increased in 2016. McDermott attributes the increase to the cutting of other drugs into heroin, particularly fentanyl, which is 50 to 100 times more powerful than morphine, and carfentanil, an elephant tranquilizer, 100 times as potent as fentanyl.

McDermott described his own descent into addiction. He had been a varsity hockey and lacrosse player beginning as a freshman, so he socialized with that older group.

"It was awkward at first," he said, but sharing their drugs helped him fit in, he recalled. And he socially distanced himself from the "bad kids" who sold him drugs. He went to Pace University on a lacrosse scholarship, still always seeking the opioid high. But when he lost the scholarship because of a procedural error in transferring to Dominican College to be with his girlfriend, he slid further into addiction.

Rather than spending his 20th birthday with his adored girlfriend, he went to the movies with the dealer who supplied him with pharmaceuticals. The dealer had no pills that night, only heroin. In the dealer's Nissan Xterra, McDermott snorted the powder from the cover of rapper Eminem's CD "Relapse." McDermott does not remember what movie they saw.

A few months later he began shooting heroin. When his roommate discovered a needle and mentioned it in front of his girlfriend, McDermott was stung by her look of "utmost disappointment, confusion and fear."

He subsequently went into rehab, but without lasting success. By the time he went into treatment the last time, he had alienated her and numerous others he loved, he said. But having to support himself, he was still functional, selling cars at a Ford dealership. During lunch breaks, he drove new cars without license plates down the freeway to buy drugs.

Once, when he came back, he joined the general manager and an employee, who were smoking cigarettes. When he pulled his cigarettes from his pocket, the bag of white powder fell out. He casually tossed it in the trash. But the manager approached him later with the bag and asked if he needed help. That was when McDermott last went into treatment.

McDermott had met Iacona when they were roommates in a sober house earlier, as they went in and out of treatment and sobriety.

"We kept relapsing, one clean, the other not. But we never got high together, out of a sense of mutual responsibility," says McDermott. At those times, they went out of touch. "When we were together, we were like silly frat boys who don't drink or do drugs."

Iacona steered McDermott to Meridian Treatment Solutions in Florida.

"You live in a house and you're driven to a clinic for therapy," McDermott said. "On weekends, you go to the beach and movies. During the week you go to a gym. You go to Narcotics Anonymous groups in public. You get \$75 a week for food. You cook your own food and clean up." He compared that to state institutions, where people eat in a cafeteria and mostly stay in one place.

He has not used heroin since December 17, 2014, he says.

But on a recent day, having lunch at Cascarino's Italian restaurant, where he had worked as a teen, he said that owner Tony Cascarino and many others in town and beyond likely know his history. But he feels comfortable with that.

"I know and love who I am. This is my journey," he said.

He recently visited the manager at the Ford dealership where he had worked.

"He offered me a job," said McDermott.






