Carjacking ends in pursuit, crash

Marshfield police officers have made an arrest following two carjackings and a pursuit that ended in a crash. On Monday, Oct. 4 suspect Shawn Hougardy, 46, allegedly jumped in an unoccupied, running vehicle that was on W Highway and tried to get away. However, the owner

caught him before he could drive off and pulled the suspect out of the vehicle.

"The suspect then ran across I-44 towards Orscheln," explained Marshfield Police Chief Doug Fannen. "Just a few minutes later there was a citizen that was going inside Casey's on the Spur for a cup of coffee and the same suspect jumped in his car and drove off."

From there, officers were

looking for the suspect and were able to track his movement in the vehicle via Onstar before getting into a brief pursuit.

"The suspect headed north down South Buffalo and couldn't negotiate the turn at Maple, skidding across the road and into multiple vehicles parked at a Marshfield residence," added Fannen.

Refund available for increased Missouri gas tax

Each gallon of gas you purchase in Missouri now comes with an additional 2.5 cents more in taxes, an increase intended for state road improvement. At the end of the 2021 legislative session, lawmakers voted to increase the gas tax for the first time in decades.

Effective Oct. 1, Missouri's motor fuel tax rate increased from 17 cents per gallon to 19.5 cents per gallon.

Under Senate Bill 262, Missouri's motor fuel tax rate will increase by the 2.5 cents per gallon annually on July 1 until it reaches 29.5 cents in July 2025.

"I voted no because it's been on the ballot twice and the voters have rejected it. I work for the people and to me a no vote on the ballot is pretty clear, that is my personal view," said Rep. Hannah Kelly (District 141).

"However, I highly respect and commend the people who supported and sponsored this bill for coming

up with a compromised solution and including a refund mechanism. That was appreciated by me and many others, even though I voted against the bill."

Some customers will be able to receive a refund of the 2.5 cent tax increase they pay on Missouri motor fuel in vehicles weighing less than 26,000 pounds for highway use from Oct. 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Though refund claims will not be available for customers until Jul 1, 2022, they will need to start saving their receipts now.

In Memoriam DAN C. BECKNER

November 16, 1937 – September 29, 2021

For more than two decades, the establishment and development of Hidden Waters Nature Park (located in the heart of Marshfield, MO) has been the on-going vision of its founder, Dan Beckner. This native son grew up on a 320-acre dairy farm, graduated from Marshfield High School in 1955 and then, after retiring in 1994, returned to the area with his wife, Zoann. Dan's career time away from the area had included a decade of teaching music followed by becoming a job trainer for the state of Missouri.



ized because of Dan's generous time, labor, and his ongoing and significant financial donations. Visitors to the park would often encounter him working there. He always stopped whatever he was doing to speak with people, telling them all about this park that he loved so much. And he would always say: "Don't call it 'work'. It is therapy!"

Dan was the driving force behind the purchase of the house located at the Hubble Drive entrance to the park five years ago. His vision was to turn the building into a Welcome Center. Regrettably, he will not be here to see the project's completion. It will be called the "Dan and Zoann Beckner Welcome Center." We hope that he would have approved.

Dan and Zoe purchased the original three-acre site for Hidden Waters in 1998. Following that initial investment, Dan was the main overseer of the growth and development of the actual park which was formally established five years later. The Park was real-

RECEIPTS: Refund available for increased Missouri gas tax

"The refund form has not been finished yet, so we don't know what it looks like yet. There are a lot of unanswered questions, and there is a lot of education that has to happen from elected officials to the public," Kelly added.

The refund claim form will be available on the Department of Revenue's website prior to July 1, 2022. Once the form becomes available, citizens will have until Sept. 30, 2022 to submit a claim for their refund.

In order to receive a refund, customers who have purchased fuel will need to maintain records of each purchase and keep those available for inspection by the Missouri Department of Revenue for three years.

The following information will be required when submitting a refund claim:

1. Vehicle identification number of the motor vehicle into which the motor fuel was delivered;
2. Date of sale;
3. Name and address of purchaser;
4. Name and address of seller;
5. Number of gallons purchased; and
6. Number of gallons purchased

and charged Missouri fuel tax, as a separate item.

The Department will be developing an online system so that customers can electronically file a claim and receive the approved refund. As the tax increases annually on July 1, customers may request a refund of the Missouri motor fuel tax increase paid each year: 2.5 cents in 2022, 5 cents in 2023, 7.5 cents in 2024, 10 cents in 2025, and then 12.5 cents in 2026 and each year after.

"The biggest take away from this is that the citizenry does not need to let this experience make them feel like their vote doesn't matter and I would say that communication to the elected officials is paramount now more than ever because we are facing a lot of diverse issues and we have a lot that we have to get to the bottom of as we go into year three and four of the Biden administration," she added. "I think anyone who is against what has happened here needs to remember that this is why your vote matters and ask the hard questions of those of us who come into office. Communicate with us even in those moments when we may make a vote that you disagree with."

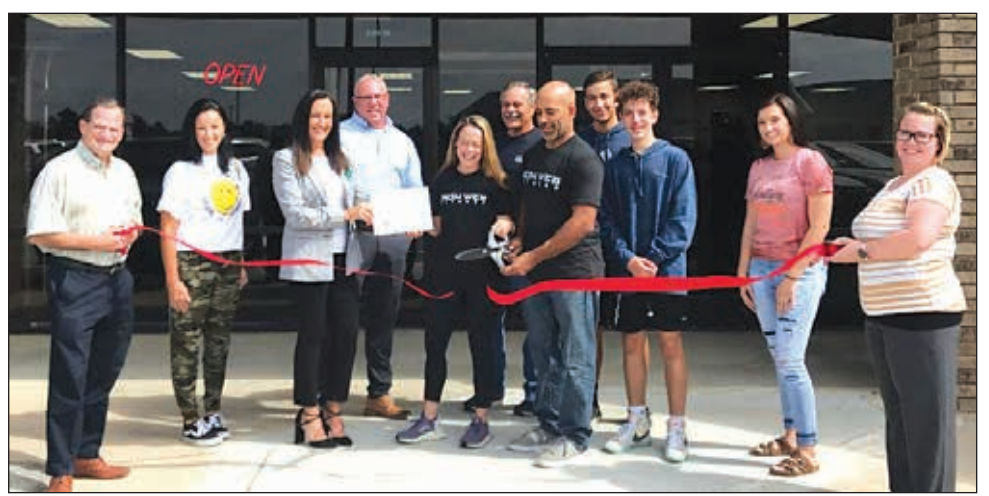

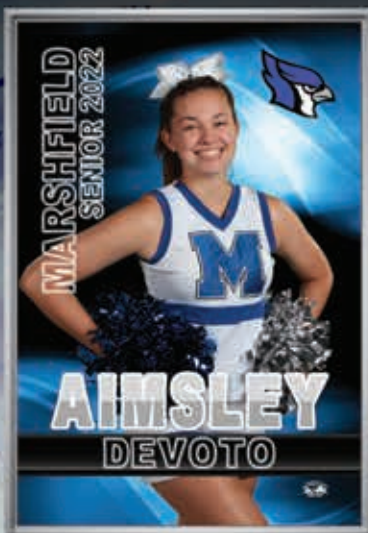

Jays' run game haunts Wolves in **HOMECOMING WIN**

Marshfield scored arguably its best win of the season Friday, and did so in fashion on homecoming night.

The run game for the Blue Jays was unrivaled, totaling over 400 yards in a 50-28 victory over Reeds Spring.

It marked the first time Marshfield had topped the half-century mark in a game since Oct. 25, 2013, a 52-47 win over Springfield Catholic.

Blue Jays head coach Cody Bull was satisfied after the victory. After all, it's more fun to learn lessons from wins than losses.

"I told them afterward that obviously we have a lot of things we can do better, but I want them to focus on enjoying winning our homecoming game, and beating a good opponent that keeps us in the race for a conference championship," Bull said. "I was proud of how they fought. There were struggles and they made big plays that got us at times, but our guys didn't let it phase them and made plays when we needed them."

The defense lost receivers over the top on several occasions, and coupled with several fumbles by junior quarterback

Bryant Bull. Reeds Spring had its opportunities to take what was a blowout midway through and force Marshfield to strap back in and keep putting up the points after halftime.

"[Bryant's] super competitive and trying to score every time

he runs it," Coach Bull said. "Those are some of the things we talk about. Sometimes you have to be Bruce Wayne instead of Batman."

Still, he factored into five Marshfield touchdowns, completing 13-of-20 passes for 142

yards and two scores through the air, while adding 162 yards on the ground and three scores. That included Marshfield's first TD, which followed by a safety, gave the hosts a quick 9-0 lead.

Tyler Young's short third-down TD grab made it 16-0, and though the Wolves recovered a fumble, Mason Mellington got one back for the Jays that allowed for another score by sophomore Dayvion Harris, who had a career day with 233 yards on 29 carries.

Bull added to Reeds Spring's woes by taking off for a 65-yard run that reached the end zone and made it 29-0 still in the first half. Although the Wolves were able to get on the board before intermission, Bull tucked in and ran in for another score four minutes into the second half to make it a 36-8 lead.

At that point, Reeds Spring conjured up a few responses offensively. A long kickoff return to the Jays' 22-yard line led to a quick TD pass from QB Blandy Burall to James Dowdy, and a conversion to Addison Abshire made it 36-16 just 16 seconds after Bull's score.

After stopping Marshfield on 4th-and-2, the Wolves got it back and worked through the air before Dowdy evaded a tackle on a 40-yard catch-and-run TD that made it 36-22 with over four minutes remaining in the third.

After both teams came up dry on the next few possessions, Reeds Spring let a big opportunity slip on a dropped potential pick-6. Instead, the Wolves committed defensive pass interference, then a horse collar penalty that positioned Marshfield in the red zone, and Harris spun and bounced the final 13 yards and extended the lead back to three scores.

"I was a defensive coordinator for a long time, and nothing good happens after a dropped interception," Coach Bull said. "Sometimes you can make a great play, but if you don't finish it off, it can go the other direction and breathe life into the other team."

The second play of the Wolves' next possession, junior Tyler Menzies came up with an interception. It led to the Jays' final TD, a face-up jump-and-catch by Kyle Jones in the back of the end zone with 7:33 left.

Although a fourth-down penalty against the Jays' defense gave way to another eight points, the offense moved the sticks enough to wear down the clock in the time that remained.

With the win, Marshfield improves to 4-2 on the year, while the Wolves fall to 3-3.

The Blue Jays face a tough road test in Week 7 as they travel to Aurora (5-1), hoping to avenge a 40-13 defeat from last season.

Lady Jays rally falls just short to Glendale

Between three wins that have Marshfield softball sitting at 15-6, the Lady Jays nearly found a fourth in a 9-8 defeat to Glendale on Sept. 29.

The Jays could have been down-and-out trailing 8-2. But they managed to rally for a slim close loss against one of the toughest teams they've faced all season.

"We were using this game as a gauge to kind of see where we are, because they've beaten some people, and they're a good team," Marshfield head coach James McAnarney said. "I thought we never gave up, and I was proud of that because we could have folded the tent. [Starting pitcher] Macie Warren was the difference for us, honestly, to stay in it. Everything that went on around and behind her, she could have been done. But she stuck in there and kept us in the ball game."

Marshfield made its rally in the bottom of the fourth inning. After loading the bases against opposing starter Anna Baker, Alaura Padgett drove one back to Baker that she couldn't hold onto for the first run of the inning, then Kirsten Ward's ball hit to shallow center was dropped by the short-stop, scoring Halle Menzies to make it a four-run game.

From there, Macie Vestal hit a ball that trickled up the middle and into the grass that scored Padgett and Ally Harrison. With Kiana Massie at the plate, the Lady Jays executed a double steal that saw Audrey Odell safe at home, making it 8-7.

Able to get a run back in the top of the sixth, Glendale was pressed again in the bottom of the frame. Ward singled to left with one out, then Hayleigh Cantrell singled before Vestal

got under a ball and lifted it to deep left that scored the pinch-running Odell.

Unfortunately for the Jays, senior Riley King came on in relief at that point and stranded both runners with two more outs, then induced a double play to help preserve the win for the Falcons.

The only losses for Marshfield this year have come to teams with winning records, including several who are state-ranked. At the same time, the offense is scoring 10.9 runs per game, the most since MSHSAA's website started keeping track, which dates back over a dozen seasons.

All of it has McAnarney feeling positive. "Everything that went wrong for us [against Glendale] is very fixable. You can't fix attitude, effort; we have that. It's the little things here and there, where if we execute better, we can be a really good team."

Long ball lifts L-R over McDonald County

No one from Logan-Rogersville was hiding how much last Thursday's win over McDonald County meant.

"It's always our favorite game — at least my favorite game — we talk about it all year," L-R senior catcher Jenna Lane said.

As a sophomore, Lane hit an unforgettable game-winning grand slam that pushed her team past the Mustangs in sectionals. With her team ranked first in Class 3 and McDonald County No. 4 in Class 4, she blasted the first of the Lady Wildcats' three home runs in a 9-7 victory.

When asked if she particularly enjoyed going yard against them, Lane replied, "Yes, my third one. It felt great."

Since suffering a 3-2 loss to the Mustangs in 2018, L-R and the senior class that includes Lane have now taken four straight from them. All have been decided by three runs or less.

None have seen so many balls leave the yard as this one, though. Cassidy Coombes' two-run homer followed Lane's solo shot in the bottom of the third that put the Wildcats ahead 5-2.

The Mustangs returned the favor in the top of the fourth inning. With two outs, Reagan Myrick took the ninth pitch of her at-bat against Jenna McKenzie over the fence to tie the game 5-5. Two pitches later, Jacie Frencken put it over the wall in left field to give McDonald County the lead.

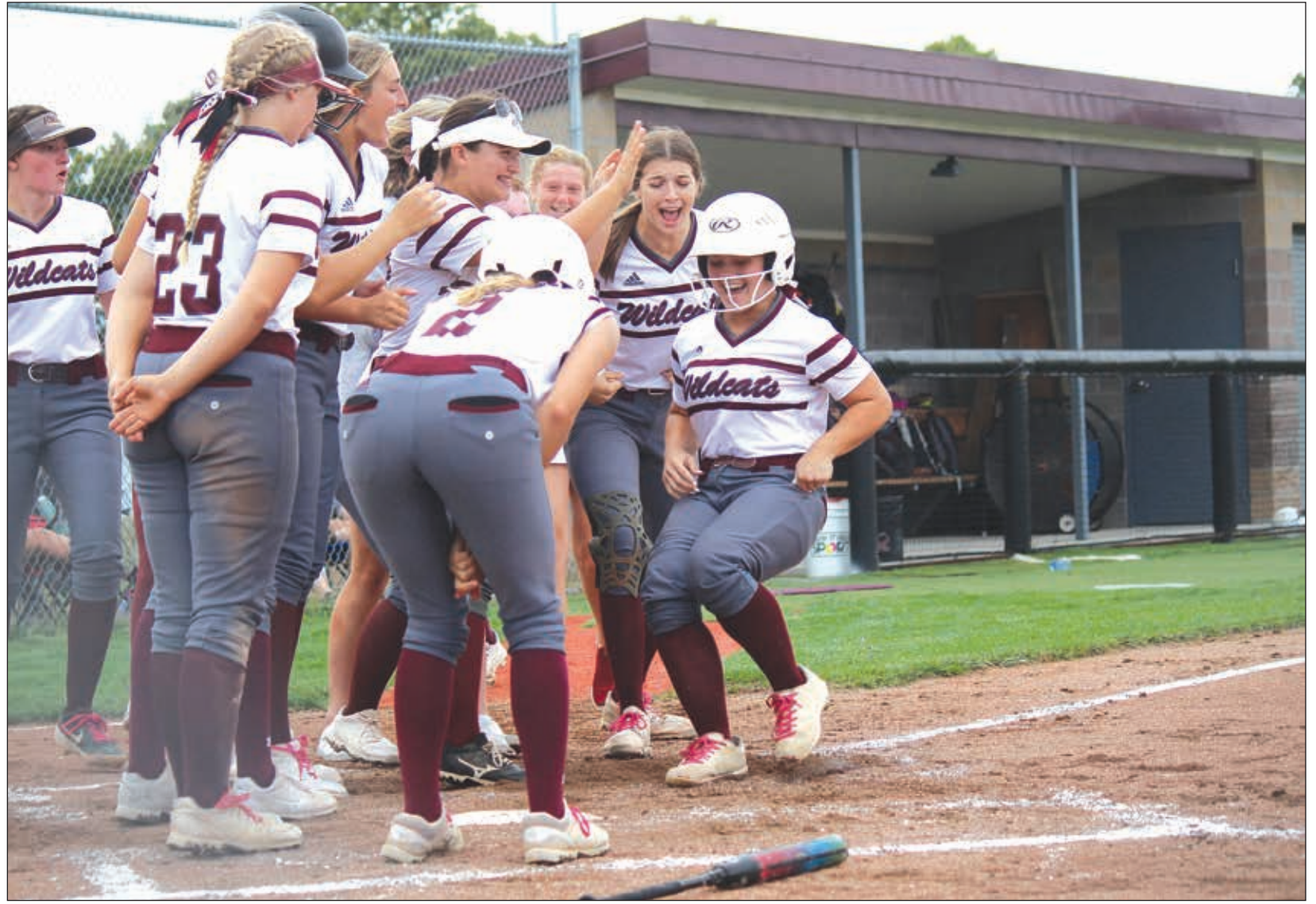
Fittingly, a grand slam decided the affair when L-R took the plate next. Kendall Meadors and Rachel Bass hit back-to-back singles, then Lane walked to load the bases. With two outs, Maddie Evans drove the first pitch from Neveah Dodson out of the park for the three-run lead.

"It was high, down the middle," Evans said. "I kind of knew it was going over, but I wasn't positive, so I was running hard. I was thinking it was the perfect time to do it with the bases loaded."

That didn't stop the Mustangs from making it another nail-biter. Dodson doubled to center to start the top of the sixth, then scored on a line-drive single. Madeline McCall singled as the next batter to represent the tying run, but McKenzie got Adasyn Leach to pop out to Gracie Kibby at short to escape the jam.

After allowing a line drive-double to lead off the seventh, McKenzie got three straight outs to record the complete-game win.

said that he didn't expect the game's outcome to be so dependent on home runs.

"We tried to stay away from the inside of the plate just because the wind was blowing straight to the left-field foul line, and actually we ended up throwing the ball to the inside because they're such an inside-out swinging team, and they do a great job of waiting on the ball," McHenry said. "Really, the home runs we ended up giving up were on the outside part of the plate."

Rogersville also faced Dodson in the jambo-ree. Like the Wildcats with Halle Miles, McDonald County (18-5) was also withholding its all-state ace, McCall (knee), from pitching due to injury.

"[McDonald County head coach Heath Alumbaugh] said [McCall] was ready to go tonight if he needed

her," McHenry said. In McHenry's eyes, that did nothing to diminish what the win meant. "It's important,

because it's the first really good team where we got a lead and had to come back from behind and hold it. I

think in all facets, it's important how we did it, who it was, and the time of year."

"I hope this helps us

make the jump forward. Our whole thing is, we want to make sure we're ready and Jenna [McKenzie] is ready for districts."

On Friday, Rogersville followed up with games in the Springfield Invitational. McKenzie struck out six and allowed just four hits in the first, a 12-3 victory over Seneca. Gracie Kibby homered and drove in four runs in that win, while McKenzie had three hits and Coombes had two, as did Meghan Hager.

Later, McKenzie also went all six innings and Hager had three hits, but L-R managed just six as a team and lost 2-1 to Willard, ranked ninth in Class 4.

Three of L-R's losses this season have come to the top three teams in Class 5. The Wildcats, expected to be the top seed in their district, are yet to be defeated by a team in Class 3 or lower this year.

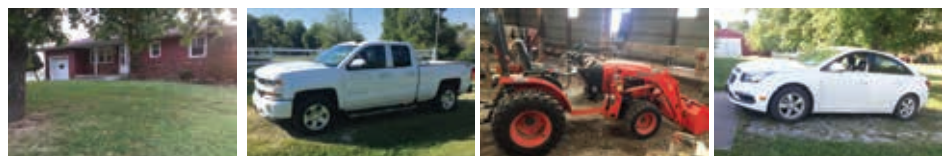
