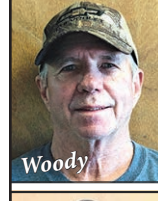

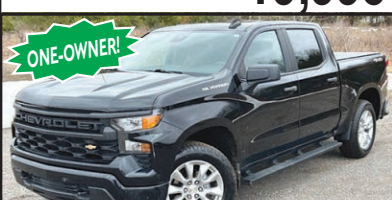

IRON COUNTY - The West Iron County Schools announces its Early Childhood Registration for GSRP/Pre-Kindergarten and Tot-Lot for the 2025-2026 school year.

To register for PreK/GSRP, Tot-Lot or to pick-up Registration Packets for GSRP/PreK can be picked up the PreK classroom at the Bates School – please use the North Entrance, facing US 2 and ring the bell, or stop in at the Stambaugh Elementary Office of the Administration Office. Tot-Lot registrations can be taken over the phone.

Children must be four years of age by Dec. 1, 2025 to enroll in GSRP/Pre-Kindergarten. It is a half-day program, parents may choose a.m. or p.m. session. It is free and runs four days a week and bussing is provided.

Children must be three years old for Tot-Lot. There is a \$80 tuition fee for each 10 week session.

Parents are asked to attach copies of their child's birth certificate and current immunization records.

# 2025 Phelps Maple Syrup Fest Recap

PHELPS, Wis. - The 14th Annual Phelps Maple Syrup Fest was held April 5 at Phelps School. The event is organized and ran by the Phelps Chamber of Commerce, who were thrilled with the incredible turnout and success of this year's event. The many activities in the event drew visitors from near and far. The Phelps Chamber estimates that thousands were in attendance. "It is great to speak with people from all over the state who come to Phelps for this event and make a weekend out of it. We had syrup producers from all over the state and the U.P. in attendance. To enter the judging contest and learn more about their craft from our local producers on the tours, and at the many demos and classes offered," commented Phelps Chamber Director Laura Richart.

The heart of the event was the tours of three Phelps sugarbushes where fest-goers can see maple syrup production in action and stock up on fantastic local maple syrup. These three sugarbushes were Jacki's Whataview Farm, Crazy Joe's Natural Products and McCaslin's Sugarbush. The cooking with maple syrup demos were really well received. Social media influencer The Tippy Housewife's demo was a Maple Meets Mexico theme sharing delicious maple tacos. Buffy Miller-Jackson of Nicolet College Culinary Arts made a fantastic herby maple dip, a maple vinaigrette and maple pancakes. Other highlights included the craft fair with over 40 vendors, fantastic food at the Maple Café from Sunrise Lodge and the Lions Club, hands-on tree tapping, classes on beekeeping and the process and health benefits of maple syrup, making maple taffy on the snow, and over 25 raffle prizes. Many fest-goers stocked up on Phelps maple syrup, of which one dollar from every bottle sold goes towards continuing education scholarships for local high school seniors.

A main event at the fest headquarters was the Maple Syrup Judging contest which boasted 36 entries from all over Wisconsin and the Midwest. Entries were evaluated on density, clarity, flavor, color and container. The celebrity tasting judges included NBC Channel 12 Meteorologist Devin Biggs, and social media influencers April from The Tippy Housewife and Jim from The Wisconsin Supper Club Chasers. They had a wonderful time engaging with the audience while tasting each of the unique syrups and identifying the underlying flavors. A huge thanks to Smoky Lake Maple Products for running the judging contest. Congratulations to Pickeral Lake Maples of Eagle River for winning Maple Syrup of the Year, and thank you to all who participated. All category winners are listed below:

The Art of Influence:  
When to Speak and When to Act

Dear Reader,

In a world overwhelmed by noise, wisdom is too often drowned out. Today, everything fights for our attention—headlines, outrage, sirens, engines—clamoring for dominance in an already crowded space.

In this chaos, many feel pressure to shout louder, interrupt more forcefully, leap ahead to be seen. But true influence works differently. The wisest among us understand that what is unseen often holds more power than what demands the spotlight. They are the chess masters—not scrambling for control of the moment, but calculating how to shape the future.

Yet there are moments when even the masters must overturn the board.

We are living through an era where democratic norms are fraying, truth is under siege, and bad actors—some loud, some disturbingly quiet—are working to undermine the pillars of liberty, justice, and human dignity.

There are times for quiet discernment.

But there are also moments when justice demands noise, when liberty demands defiance, and when democracy demands bold, public commitment. History does not look kindly on bystanders. This is not about political partisanship. It is about moral responsibility. It's about whether we believe that truth still matters. That freedom is still worth defending. That the common good still exists.

So ask yourself: What do I stand for? And what will I no longer stand by and watch?

Sometimes, the most powerful act is a whisper of reason. Other times, it's a roar of resistance. The art of influence is knowing which the moment requires—and having the courage to give it.
