2024 Ministry Review

1. SEND NETWORK PARTNERSHIP

We enter our Thirteenth year with the North American Mission Board (NAMB) and California Southern Baptist Convention (CSBC) as a "Send City". This partnership provides personnel such as Jeremy Aylett, David Godoy, Michael Jimenez, and Chase Feindel, funded by our North American Mission Board (NAMB) to assist in planting new churches.

FOCUS AREAS

Strengthen Communities

See the needs and serve the communities in each region where we have a church.

Care for Refugees

San Diego is both a border city and a port city. Refugees present real human needs. Often, refugees enter a country with few resources and unable to speak, read or understand the language. They arrive with tremendous dreams, but their needs leave them vulnerable to manipulation and abuse.

Protect Children and Families

In San Diego, the need for foster and adoptive families has never been greater. Often, lives are touched by drug and alcohol use, abuse, neglect, disease and poverty. Send Relief can help you and your church demonstrate unconditional love, support gospel reconciliation and help biological, foster and adoptive families thrive through a Family Advocacy Ministry.

· Fight Human Trafficking.

They are in your community and around the world. They are often hidden in plain sight. The Enemy is indiscriminate and preys on the strong and vulnerable alike. But there is hope! Ministry to victims and survivors can be complex, but Send Relief is here to help you and your church fight for freedom—both physical and spiritual.

Respond to Crisis.

When responding to disasters, our primary partner is Southern Baptist Disaster Relief. Across all fifty states, thousands of volunteers respond when a crisis hits, quickly providing assistance ranging from serving hot meals to helping families clean up after a storm.

Our largest ethnic group of churches in San Diego is Hispanic. Our SDSBA Hispanic Fellowship is organized to serve it's culture. Training, fellowship events, and a retreat is sponsored for our Spanish language churches.

7. PARTY TRAILERS AND PORTABLE BAPTISTERY

The Association has three fully supplied party trailers for our churches to use to reach out to their communities. At a reasonable cost, each trailer is supplied with cotton candy machine, snow cone machine, popcorn machine, video and audio sound equipment, inflatable bounce house for children, along with electrical generators, easy-up tents, and much more.

A portable Baptistery is available upon request for participating churches.

8. MINISTRY COACHING

Coaching resources are available to churches, pastors, and ministry leaders. This includes





Business Services Marc Tempesta, CFO

As of the end of June, Cooperative Program giving is at 45.42% of budget which is down 7.6% from June last year. CP continues to decline while our churches experience the challenges of

inflation. The California Mission Offering, meanwhile, is at 33.70% which is slightly down from June last year. 100% of funds given through CMO stay in California and provide direct ministry support in California, through our teams and the local church.

Our Business Services team includes Sally Cook, Audrey Hernandez, Steve Foss, and Laura Hamilton. Our team provides liaison to both the finance and business services committees, as well as reports to the Executive Committee. The primary responsibilities for our office are finance, risk management, legal, building and office oversight, and human resources.

Through tough losses in 2024, our Communications team perseveres and is grateful to be a conduit of resources for you. California Mission Offering assets were more robust than ever with nine video options to

By the same token, what a privilege it has been this year for us to connect California Baptists to state and national agencies through 7 Questions and other features, furthering the message of our Ethnic brothers and sisters to the broader SBC family, as well as shining a light the on the beauty of Christ's diverse Church like only California can.



Executive Report

Blessings My Dear Family,

The past 12 months have been filled with celebration, challenges, and casting vision. Representing CSBC throughout the state, I see and celebrate what God is doing in His Church. I also have the unique opportunity to hear and witness the challenges California churches are experiencing, and that we, too, have experienced at CSBC as we seek to resource the Great Commission work. Finally,

it has been a time for vision casting into the next season for your convention missionaries.

Celebration - This year we honored over 50 Champions who serve alongside CSBC missionary staff to accomplish the work of serving our churches at our Champions Retreat. CSBC Champions accomplish various ministry tasks, including: VBS and evangelism trainings, they come alongside the work with Feeding Those Who Feed Us in migrant centers across the state, while others serve alongside those amid disaster in need of help, hope, and healing. We also celebrated with our associations, national partners, and in-state partners that joined in countless ways to do the work of the Kingdom. Some of those partnership stories you have read already. Let's count the blessings God is doing in California.

Challenges - Since 2020, churches have struggled to rebound in regular attendance. For many, it has been small steady growth toward regular attendance. We continue to pray for healthy growth where fellowships can support Kingdom ministries. The recent economy continues to wreak havoc, however, as financial growth has not reflected attendance patterns. Many congregations are having to choose between pastor pay, facility maintenance, or to support missions through the Cooperative Program. The state convention also struggles to sustain ministries. Since 2022, Cooperative Program giving dropped by over \$700,000, resulting in 7 layoffs over the past 12 months. Our team continues its work despite the losses to the best of our abilities.

Vision - Last October, at our Annual Meeting, I shared my desire to see our churches reach 2% of California's population by 2033. Since then, I have heard various pastors and faith leaders share what they need to grow and multiply. Seeking to better serve you, I continue to work with key leaders in the state to revision the focus of CSBC's mission teams. I look forward to our annual meeting and updating the churches on all the things we have heard and where we are as a state convention. Wise counsel advises me to be cautious, assuring the vision is feasible and measurable. I covet your prayers as I ask God to lead us in this process; that He would affirm the work of our hands.

Thank you for supporting the work we do as Southern Baptists. I am grateful for your partnership and for what God allows us to do together for His Kingdom. To God be the glory for the work He does through His Church.

Church Matters Initiative Team

The Church Matters Initiatives Team has made significant strides in improving the accessibility of resources for local churches. You can easily see the long list of "tools" by perusing the new Church Matters webpage.

Pastors and administrators can easily access the Annual Church Profile and resources for writing bylaws and keeping compliant with state laws. They can also request Building Repair and

Improvement Grants as well as an extensive demographics report of their community. Church Matters provides benevolence for pastors facing a crisis due to health issues. We offer grants to help pastors attend workshops, such as Simeon Trust and those hosted by Gateway Seminary, to enhance skills for ministry.

Church Matters has partnered with Church HR Network to provide an exclusive HR180 membership portal, the comprehensive library of essential compliance documents designed to meet your church's HR needs, with direct access to a dedicated team ready to assist with any questions or concerns.

We have also partnered with Converge Coaching. These 23 certified coaches are trained to come alongside to help you achieve greater effectiveness and make significant progress toward growth.

Thank you for sending your 413 musicians from 73 churches to our music and worship improvement workshops, spending nearly four hours of the day developing skills with our high-quality instructors.

The CSBC Women's Ministry Network continues actively engaging, encouraging, equipping, inspiring, and igniting women across California and beyond. The ministry celebrates many achievements, including 70+ attendees at the Minister's Wives Luncheon, 85+ women at the NorCal Women's Gathering, 40+ attendees at the Women in Ministry Spanish Leadership Conference, and 70 participants at two Associational Women's Retreats. The Ministry also launched the first-ever CSBC Women in Ministry cohort group.

The WMN proudly partners with many other state, ethnic, and fellowship groups which you can read about in the 2024 CSBC state annual meeting book of reports in Riverside.



Evangelism Initiative Team

The Evangelism Initiatives Team exists to empower California Churches to take the Gospel to every neighborhood and people. The Evangelism Team has three initiatives to assist churches in reaching their communities with the Gospel.

1. Evangelism Workshops conducted in partnership with Associations - We provided 25 trainings statewide followed by an opportunity to access evangelism grants to implement what the

churches learned in the trainings. Last year we resourced 334 churches through training and grants. They reported a total of 4,261 decisions for Christ as a result and shared the Gospel with 120,034! Set Free Church in Kern County had a street outreach event and was able to supply food, drinks, backpacks, and obtain sound equipment. They ministered to 300 attendees and counted 20 salvations and 15 rededications.

- 2. The Ignition Student Conference to resource churches for Kingdom advancement. Last year we held two Ignition (Empowered by LIFT) Student Evangelism Conferences reaching over 1,400 students (an incredible success from the under 600 just a few years prior)! Our CSBC Youth Champion, RJ McCauley from Magnolia Church, is doing an outstanding job. There were 354 salvations and call to ministry decisions!
- 3. Vacation Bible School Training Last year we trained over 250 VBS leaders through three regional English trainings and four Spanish trainings.





Missions Initiative Francis Chung, Team Leader

The Missions team continues to reach the agricultural workers for Christ. CSBC's outreach to agricultural workers, Feeding Those Who Feed Us (FTWFU), led by Oscar Sanchez, has witnessed 3,301 decisions for Christ. The recruitment of 12 regional directors is still ongoing, the FTWFU ministry manual was updated to preserve institutional knowledge, and the process for churches to participate was streamlined.

As FTWFU looks to the future, concerted effort has been made to find the next generation of ministry leaders.

One overseas mission trip was completed in Europe, another planned for Fall 2024, and several more in 2025. Plans are underway for IMB personnel to conduct mobilization/training events in California and for IMB practitioners to work directly with CSBC churches to create church-specific mission strategies incorporating IMB's core missionary task. The result is having IMB's presence in California, building ties with missionaries, and increasing mission endeavors starting in California that will have a global reach. Furthermore, CSBC is spearheading a new missionary parent's fellowship for IMB missionaries that call California home. Lastly, several gatherings between IMB and California leaders are strengthening ties between our two organizations in Virginia, California, and oversees.

CSBC Disaster Relief

CSBDR continues to work through the local church to provide help, hope, and healing to those affected by disaster to see lives changed by the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

This year we focused on increasing ministry awareness with CSBC churches. We trained nearly 200 volunteers, and provided disaster response and relief worldwide, including in Moldova and Ukraine, where chaplains trained others and ministered to those serving in refugee camps. Additionally, our

teams took part in fire and flood recovery operations in Hawaii, Texas, and New Mexico, as well as responded to incidents throughout California, such as flood recovery in San Diego County and fire relief in Tehama County. We also assisted in winter storm clean-up and fire recovery in Mariposa County, supported winter storm clean-up in Tuolumne County, and responded to long-term recovery operations in Sacramento, Merced, and Mariposa counties with chaplains and feeding teams.

I'm continually humbled by the unwavering support and generosity of our churches and associations. Your prayers, encouragement, and support are a constant source of strength for our teams. Every week I receive emails and phone calls letting me know our teams are being prayed for. I'm grateful for your associational leadership and your support of CSBDR.

Church Planting Stats:

- 151 church planters in partnership with Send Network California
- 41 churches planted between September 1, 2023 August 31, 2024, including 23 non-Anglo churches (3 African American, 5 Asian, 13 Hispanic, 2 Middle Eastern)
- 1,109 baptisms this year as of August 31, 2024

Highlight #1: There is a Slavic Church Planting movement catalyzing across North America! Bogdan Kipko, has become a multiplier and identified 60+ Slavic potential planters. Two have been assessed and we are working on ways to capitalize on this momentum.

Highlight #2: In Spring 2024, we hosted the San Diego Spouse Retreat for church planting wives on Catalina Island.

Highlight #3: God is on the move. The Bay Area has hosted three Sending Church Labs to ignite an indigenous church planting movement, where local church pastors and leaders have spent pivotal time together to pray and develop their vision to be sending churches.





Report to California Southern Baptist Associations



Resourcing the Great Commission

The Baptist Foundation of California exists to serve Baptists in the West by raising, managing, and distributing resources for Kingdom causes. We accomplish these purposes through institutional investing, church lending, and estate planning.

God has blessed us with outstanding performance in these areas over the past several years. I am grateful to report that He is allowing our staff to continue their excellent work in 2024. Here are some of the highlights of our work as we partner with you to resource the Great Commission.



In 2023 we distributed nearly \$13 million to our partners and beneficiaries to help them resource the Great Commission. We are grateful to build the Kingdom in this way.

The Foundation's total assets under management grew to \$225 million as of December 31, 2023. Despite uncertain economic conditions, our assets under management increased to more than \$242 million as of September 30, 2024. God is blessing our work in remarkable ways, and we are grateful.



Our lending team assisted dozens of churches in 2023 providing more than \$5,755,000 for property acquisition, renovations, and new construction. Loan demand from churches has leveled off in the past couple of years due to rising interest rates, increased construction costs, and tightening of monetary policy. Our team anticipates closing over \$6 million of church loans by year end and continues to consult and advise multiple churches with financing and facility needs.



Our legal team has conducted Estate Planning seminars in more than 25 churches and anticipates completing over 30 seminars by year end. We encourage Baptists to bless their families and provide resources for their local church and our Baptist entities through biblical estate planning. We have already exceeded our 2024 goal of \$5 million in estate planning pipeline gifts to Southern Baptist causes with nearly \$16 million already in the pipeline this year. Nearly one-third of these planned gifts will go directly to local CSBC churches. We offer free estate planning services to Lead Pastors who encourage their congregations in this area by hosting an estate planning seminar. We would love to plan a seminar for your church to encourage your congregants to leave a Christian legacy to resource the Great Commission.

This year our board assumed the grant approval process for So Cal Baptist Ministry Grants. In August about 70 grant requests were reviewed and approved providing about \$200,000 for local CSBC churches to do evangelism and outreach events in their local communities. A new grant portal is operational and provides an efficient and streamlined way to apply for grants. Since 2018, 13,000 people have come to faith in Jesus Christ as a result of the outreach events funded through So Cal grants. We are positioned to track these grants and the number of people who come to faith in Christ through this amazing resource. We celebrate all that God has done in the last ten years through this incredible Kingdom resource and look forward to God using this endowment for Kingdom work in the future.

SoCal Baptist Ministries is a great example of the long-lasting impact of endowments. That is why we created four new endowments in 2022 to benefit four of our key partners and seeded each of those endowments with \$70,000. Through investment earnings and additional contributions from the BFC and our partners, these endowments have already grown to a total of more than \$1,000,000 in a couple of short years. We anticipate providing additional funding to each of those endowments annually as God blesses our work. We want to bless our partners: CBU, CSBC, Gateway, and Mission Dignity as God blesses us. As our partners continue to invest resources with us and God's blessings remain on our work, we will be faithful to provide additional funding for His work.

Our ministry clearly has a financial focus, but it is also about the people God has called us to serve. Every morning our team meets together and prays specifically for several pastors and churches by name and sends a follow-up prayer card. We have prayed for every California Southern Baptist Convention (CSBC) pastor and church by name and our staff has personally visited with hundreds of pastors in the last twelve months. We continue to sponsor pastors and wives' events, gatherings, and retreats across our state. We love pastors and all our partners and commit to doing all we can to support the ministries God has called them to lead.

Thank you for the trust you place in our team, your support and prayers, and your partnership for the sake of the Gospel.

And Now I'd like to turn our attention to this year's recipients of the Baptist Foundation's Award of Excellence. This award is has been given for forty years at the convention to recipients who demonstrate strong and dedicated commitment to their own churches and our state convention and have made a significant contribution to Baptist work in the west! The 2024 recipients are Gil and Eva De La Rosa. The De La Rosa's have been serving Southern Baptists since 1976. Both Gil and Eva have served three churches all here in California. Eva is currently the Executive Director of the California Woman's Missionary Union and Gil is the Director of Missions for the Gold Coast Baptist Association and is serving as the President of the California Director of Missions Fellowship. Both Gil and Evan have impressive academic credentials.

They have two adult children, Rachel Morales, a CBU graduate, is the Academic Dean at Oaks Christian Middle School, Westlake Village and Josh De La Rosa, also CBU and Gateway graduate is the Leader Pastor of Stone Arbor Church, Riverside. Gil and Eva have five grandchildren and five great grandchildren. This award comes with a plaque and a generous financial gift. 
